House Resolution

A resolution designating May 24, 2004, as "Aviation Maintenance Technician Day" in Florida.

WHEREAS, in 1965, 9 years after his death at 87, a little-known participant in the birth of aviation was inducted by the United States Air Force Museum into the Aviation Hall of Fame and, as a further tribute, the Charles Taylor Master Mechanic Award has been established in his honor by which the Federal Aviation Administration recognizes persons with 50 years or more of aviation maintenance experience, and

WHEREAS, born May 24, 1868, Charles Edward Taylor, often referred to as the "Unsung Hero of Aviation," is now recognized as the first aviation mechanic in powered flight, the man who built and maintained the engine of the Wright Brothers' craft that on December 17, 1903, changed the course of history, and

WHEREAS, in the century since that historic event, countless individuals have followed in the footsteps of Charlie Taylor, applying their skills to the maintenance of planes that transport passengers and cargo, carry out daring rescue and humanitarian missions, and protect the skies over our nation, and

WHEREAS, spurred by the Federal Aviation Administration, many states are electing to observe "Aviation Maintenance Technician Day" in an effort to focus well-merited attention on these vital members of the aviation industry who, largely unnoticed, work quietly behind the scenes, to ensure the viability and safety of the nation's aircraft, and

WHEREAS, May 24, Charlie Taylor's birthday, has been chosen by the Federal Aviation Administration as an appropriate date on

which to honor America's aviation maintenance technicians, and the Southern Region of the Administration, which includes eight southeastern states and the Caribbean, is urging an enthusiastic observance of Aviation Maintenance Technician Day, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives designates May 24, 2004, as "Aviation Maintenance Technician Day" in Florida and wholeheartedly joins the Southern Region of the Federal Aviation Administration in urging Floridians to express their gratitude to the state's own "unsung heroes of aviation," its aviation maintenance technicians.
