1 House Resolution

A resolution expressing condolences to the families of the victims who lost their lives in the March 11, 2004, terrorist attacks in Madrid and deepest sympathy to the individuals who were injured in those attacks and to the people of the Kingdom of Spain.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2004, over 200 individuals were killed and more than 1,000 were wounded when three commuter trains in Madrid were blasted by almost simultaneous bomb explosions that plunged an entire nation into a state of horrified disbelief and deep mourning, and

WHEREAS, referred to as the worst terrorist attacks in the history of the Kingdom of Spain, these callous acts of violence were maliciously timed to cause the most damage at the height of the rush hour, once again demonstrating that terrorism knows neither limits nor borders, and

WHEREAS, a strong advocate for the ideals of freedom and democracy, Spain is deeply appreciated by the citizens and residents of the State of Florida for its efforts to eradicate terrorism in its own nation and worldwide, and

WHEREAS, intensely aware of its close ties with the people of Spain, the State of Florida continues to stand with that nation in opposing the threat of international terrorism to Spain, to the United States, and to all peace-loving peoples around the world, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That the House of Representatives expresses its condolences to the families of the victims who lost their lives in the March 11, 2004, terrorist attacks in Madrid and its deepest sympathy to the individuals who were injured in those attacks and to the people of the Kingdom of Spain.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House of Representatives wholeheartedly supports the provision of appropriate assistance to the people of Spain during this time of grief and mourning and appeals to the United States Government to continue to work with the Government of Spain as an ally in the fight against terrorism.
