This bill re-creates the Florida Drug, Device, and Cosmetic Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Florida Drug, Device, and Cosmetic Trust Fund, FLAIR # 64-2-173, is administered by the Department of Health. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-42, Laws of Florida.

This bill re-creates section 499.057, Florida Statutes.
