House Resolution

A resolution recognizing March as "Women's History Month" in Florida.

WHEREAS, Florida's women of every race, class, and ethnic background have made historic contributions to the growth and strength of Florida in countless recorded and unrecorded ways, and

 WHEREAS, Florida's women have played and continue to play a critical economic, cultural, and social role in every sphere of the life of the state by constituting a significant portion of the labor force working inside and outside of the home, and

WHEREAS, Florida's women have played a unique role throughout the history of the nation by providing countless hours of volunteer labor for the state, and

WHEREAS, Florida's women were particularly important in the establishment of early charitable, philanthropic, and cultural institutions in our state, and

WHEREAS, Florida's women of every race, class, and ethnic background served as early leaders in the forefront of every major progressive social change movement, and

WHEREAS, forty women, twenty-five percent of both the Florida House of Representatives and the Florida Senate, presently serve the citizens of the great state of Florida as elected members of the Florida Legislature, with thirty women in the Florida House of Representatives and ten women in the Florida Senate; four women serve in the Congress of the United States; and two women serve in the Florida executive branch, and

WHEREAS, women have been leaders not only in securing their

own rights of suffrage and equal opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and countless other movements which create a more fair and just society for all, and

WHEREAS, despite these contributions, the role of Florida's and all of America's women in history has been consistently overlooked and undervalued, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Florida:

That March be designated as "Women's History Month" to duly recognize and appreciate the outstanding contribution women have made toward the betterment of life for all. Be it further proclaimed that every Floridian is encouraged to celebrate Women's History Month with appropriate programs, activities, and ceremonies honoring the women of the great state of Florida and the United States of America.
