WHEREAS, Sister Jeanne O'Laughlin was born May 4, 1929, in
Detroit, Michigan, earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in
Biology from Sienna Heights College and a Master of Science
Technology Degree in Biology and a Ph.D. Degree in Educational
Administration from the University of Arizona, and began her
career in education in 1950 when she started teaching, and

WHEREAS, in 1981, Sister Jeanne became President of Barry 10 University and in the 23 ensuing years, employing her 11 12 extraordinary leadership skills, has led the university to 13 unprecedented growth, diversity, and prosperity, raising over \$200 million, increasing scholarship funds to \$29 million 14 15 annually, increasing enrollment from 1,750 to 9,042, doubling the number of the university academic schools from 5 to 10, 16 adding 38 new buildings, and planting more than 2,000 new trees 17 on the expanding Miami Shores campus, and 18

WHEREAS, dedicated to empowering women and minorities through higher education, Sister Jeanne has led to the university's recognition as the most diverse institution of higher learning in the Southeastern United States for the past seven years, according to U.S. News & World Report, and

WHEREAS, a dynamic leader among professional educators and selflessly committed to community service, Sister Jeanne has actively participated in and led numerous prestigious educational organizations and has been honored on many occasions, including her having received the "First Annual Life Enrichment Award" from B'nai B'rith Women of South Coastal HR 9105 2004 30 Regions, the "Women Who Make a Difference Award" from the Young 31 Women's Christian Association of Greater Miami, the "Peace and 32 Unity Award" from the St. Martin De Porres Association, and the 33 Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice Medal from Pope John-Paul II for 34 service to the Catholic Church, and

35 WHEREAS, on June 30, 2004, Sister Jeanne will end her 36 service as President of Barry University and commence a 1-year 37 sabbatical, during which she plans to finish her book of memoirs 38 entitled "Who is Love?" and lead a mission to help create 39 schools for women in other countries, with plans to return to 40 Barry University in 2005 to serve as its Chancellor, NOW, 41 THEREFORE,
