This legislation re-creates the Cultural Institutions Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Cultural Institutions Trust Fund, FLAIR #45-2-478, is administered by the Department of State. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-93, Laws of Florida, Laws of Florida and revised in Chapter 2003-401, Laws of Florida.

This trust fund serves as a dedicated fund for: statewide arts grants, arts in education and visiting arts programs, the State Touring Program, local arts agencies, and state service organizations.
