CHAMBER ACTION

The Committee on Business Regulation recommends the following:

An act relating to home inspection services; providing definitions; requiring the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to appoint a Home Inspection Services Study Group; providing for membership; providing for a study related to home inspection services; providing for a report of findings; providing for future termination of the study group; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. Home Inspection Services Study Group. --
- (1) DEFINITIONS. -- As used in this section, the term:
 - (a) "Department" means the Department of Business and Professional Regulation.
 - (b) "Home" means any residential real property, or manufactured or modular home, that is a single-family dwelling, duplex, triplex, quadruplex, condominium unit, or cooperative

unit. The term does not include the common areas of condominiums or cooperatives.

(c) "Home inspector" means any person who provides or offers to provide a home inspection for a fee or other compensation.

- (d) "Home inspection" means a limited visual examination of one or more of the readily accessible installed systems and components of a home, including the structure, electrical system, HVAC system, roof covering, plumbing system, interior components, exterior components, and site conditions that affect the structure, for the purposes of providing a written opinion of the condition of the home.
 - (2) HOME INSPECTION SERVICES STUDY GROUP. --
- (a) The department shall appoint a Home Inspection

 Services Study Group to consist of three members who are

 practicing home inspectors having a minimum of 5 years'

 experience each, one member of the Construction Industry

 Licensing Board, one member of the Florida Building Code

 Administrators and Inspectors Board, one member of the Board of

 Architecture and Interior Design, one member of the Florida Real

 Estate Appraisal Board, one member of the Board of Professional

 Engineers, one member who is licensed pursuant to part I of

 chapter 475, Florida Statutes, one consumer member, and one

 nonvoting member from the staff of the department.
- (b) The charge of the Home Inspection Services Study Group is to conduct a study regarding home inspections and the duties and responsibilities of home inspectors. The study should address whether regulation of this occupation may be appropriate

or whether there may be better alternatives to regulation. The Home Inspection Services Study Group shall consider the following factors:

- 1. Whether the unregulated practice of home inspection substantially harms or endangers the public health, safety, or welfare and whether the potential for harm is recognizable and not remote.
- 2. Whether the practice of home inspection requires specialized skill or training and whether that skill or training is readily measurable or quantifiable so that examination or training requirements would reasonably ensure initial and continuing professional or occupational ability.
- 3. Whether regulation will have an unreasonable effect on job creation or job retention in the state or will place unreasonable restrictions on the ability of individuals who seek to practice or who are practicing this occupation to find employment.
- 4. Whether the public is or can be effectively protected by other means.
- 5. Whether the overall cost-effectiveness and economic impact of regulation, including the indirect costs to consumers, will be favorable.
- (c) The study shall be completed and a report prepared by January 1, 2005, and submitted by the Home Inspection Services
 Study Group to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Secretary of Business and Professional Regulation, and the Executive Office of the Governor.
