(1) The Community Services Block Grant 23 Trust Fund within the Department of Community Affairs, FLAIR number 52-2-118, which is to be terminated pursuant to Section 24 25 19(f), Article III of the State Constitution on November 4, 26 2004, is re-created. 27 (2) All current balances of the trust fund are carried 28 forward, and all current sources and uses of the trust fund 29 are continued. 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect November 4, 31 2004.
