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31	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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33	Section 1. The Legislature finds that Florida's beach and
34	dune systems were adversely affected by Hurricanes Charley,
35	Frances, Ivan, and Jeanne and Tropical Storm Bonnie which struck
36	the state during 2004. The Legislature further finds that in
37	order to begin the recovery of these systems, the Department of
38	Environmental Protection developed the 2004 Hurricane Recovery
39	Plan for Florida's Beach and Dune System, hereinafter referred
40	to as "the plan," dated November 30, 2004, for the repair and
41	restoration of the state's beaches and dunes.
42	Section 2. The Department of Environmental Protection
43	shall provide a report to the Legislature no later than February
44	11, 2005, describing the progress made to date on the plan's
45	activities and beach and dune repair and restoration projects.
46	The report must include the dollars spent, percentage of the
47	project's completion, and funding impacts on the 2005-2006
48	fiscal year budget. The report must be submitted to the
49	Executive Office of the Governor, the President of the Senate,
50	and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

51	Section 3. (1) For the 2004-2005 fiscal year only, \$64.6
52	million from the General Revenue Fund and \$3.8 million from the
53	Land Acquisition Trust Fund are appropriated in fixed capital
54	outlay for the purpose of implementing the plan's activities and
55	beach and dune repair and restoration projects.
56	(2) Of the \$64.6 million appropriated from the General
57	Revenue Fund, the \$53.8 million for beach restoration studies
58	and dune restoration projects contained in the plan shall
59	require a local match of 10 percent to enhance or expand such
60	projects.
61	(a) The local match requirement shall not apply to any
62	county, or municipality within such county, with a per capita
63	personal income level below the state's per capita personal
64	income level, as published by the United States Department of
65	Commerce. In addition, the Executive Office of the Governor may
66	approve a waiver, subject to the requirement for legislative
67	notice and review under s. 216.177, Florida Statutes, of all or
68	a portion of the required local match for any local government.
69	The Executive Office of the Governor must determine that such a
70	match requirement cannot be provided or that doing so would
71	impose a documented hardship on the local government.
72	(b) The Department of Environmental Protection shall not
73	release the final 25 percent of state funds to be provided to
74	any local government for beach restoration studies and dune
75	restoration projects until that local government has met local
76	match requirements pursuant to this section.
77	(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 216.177, Florida
78	Statutes, requiring a 14-day notice for interim budget actions,
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CS 79 and pursuant to s. 216.351, Florida Statutes, the Executive 80 Office of the Governor shall provide notice of the allocation of the lump-sum appropriations authorized by this act into 81 82 traditional appropriations categories to the chair and vice 83 chair of the Legislative Budget Commission at least 3 working 84 days prior to the effective date of such allocation. 85 The Department of Environmental Protection is Section 4. 86 authorized to redistribute the funds appropriated in this act 87 among activities and projects, as necessary, to efficiently and 88 effectively implement the plan and to leverage federal and local 89 matching funds. Funds from these appropriations must be used to 90 implement the plan until completed or until the funds have been 91 exhausted. The department shall provide a written description 92 and justification 5 days prior to any redistribution of project 93 funds within the plan to the Executive Office of the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 94 95 Representatives. 96 Section 5. The Department of Environmental Protection is 97 directed to take the necessary steps to ensure the timely 98 implementation and completion of beach and dune repair and 99 restoration projects included within the 2004 Hurricane Recovery 100 Plan for Florida's Beach and Dune System. These steps shall include, but not be limited to, the issuance of applicable 101 102 emergency permits and rule waivers consistent with current 103 executive authority. 104 Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
