29	Section 1. The Legislature finds that Florida's beach and
30	dune systems were adversely affected by Hurricanes Charley,
31	Frances, Ivan, and Jeanne and Tropical Storm Bonnie which struck
32	the state during 2004. The Legislature further finds that in
33	order to begin the recovery of these systems, the Department of
34	Environmental Protection developed the 2004 Hurricane Recovery
35	Plan for Florida's Beach and Dune System, hereinafter referred
36	to as "the plan," dated November 30, 2004, for the repair and
37	restoration of the state's beaches and dunes.
38	Section 2. The Department of Environmental Protection
39	shall provide a report to the Legislature no later than February
40	11, 2005, describing the progress made to date on the plan's
41	activities and beach and dune repair and restoration projects.
42	The report must include the dollars spent, percentage of the
43	project's completion, and funding impacts on the 2005-2006

58	county, or municipality within such county, with a per capita
59	personal income level below the state's per capita personal
60	income level, as published by the United States Department of

86	implement the plan until completed or until the funds have been
87	exhausted. The department shall provide a written description
88	and justification 5 days prior to any redistribution of project
89	funds within the plan to the Executive Office of the Governor,
