An act relating to the Agency for Workforce Innovation; requiring the agency to provide quarterly reports on certain expenditures; requiring the report to be submitted to the Governor and Legislature; providing that the report must contain certain information; providing an appropriation; requiring that the appropriation be used for additional temporary jobs for eligible dislocated workers; authorizing the agency to spend the appropriation as permitted by the Federal Government; providing that the appropriation is nonrecurring; requiring the Executive Office of the Governor to provide notice of the allocation of the lump-sum appropriations; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Beginning January 1, 2005, the Agency for
Workforce Innovation shall provide quarterly reports on the
expenditure of federal funds received from the United States
Department of Labor under the Workforce Investment Act's
National Emergency Grant for the purpose of providing additional
temporary jobs for eligible dislocated workers to assist in the
cleanup and restoration efforts resulting from Tropical Storm
Bonnie and Hurricanes Charley, Frances, Ivan, and Jeanne. The
quarterly reports relating to the temporary-jobs program shall
be submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and
the Speaker of the House of Representatives until the grant
expires or the funds are no longer available for this program.

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30 The reports must include the number of participants who are 31 provided temporary jobs, the types of services being provided by participants in those temporary jobs, any significant 32 33 implementation problems that occurred during the reporting period, total expenditures to date, and the number of related 34 monitoring visits conducted by the Agency for Workforce 35 Innovation and the regional workforce boards. Monitoring visits 36 shall be conducted to ensure that the worksites and related 37 38 activities are consistent with the provisions of the applicable 39 federal statute and regulations. Section 2. For the 2004-2005 fiscal year, the sum of \$21 40 million is hereby appropriated from the Employment Security 41 42 Administration Trust Fund to the Agency for Workforce Innovation 43 in a lump-sum appropriation category. Such budget authority is provided for federal funds received from the United States 44 Department of Labor under the Workforce Investment Act's 45 46 National Emergency Grant to provide for additional temporary 47 jobs for eligible dislocated workers to assist in the cleanup and restoration efforts resulting from Tropical Storm Bonnie and 48 Hurricanes Charley, Frances, Ivan, and Jeanne. To the extent 49 that the United States Department of Labor modifies the grant, 50 the agency is authorized to spend the grant funds as permitted 51 by the Federal Government. 52 53 Section 3. The appropriation authorized by this act is 54 nonrecurring and is intended to address needs caused by Tropical Storm Bonnie and Hurricanes Charley, Frances, Ivan, and Jeanne. 55 56 Section 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 216.177, Florida Statutes, requiring a 14-day notice for interim 57 58 budget actions, and pursuant to section 216.351, Florida

Statutes, the Executive Office of the Governor shall provide
notice of the allocation of the lump-sum appropriation
authorized by this act into traditional appropriation categories
to the chair and vice chair of the Legislative Budget Commission
at least 3 working days prior to the effective date of such
allocation.

Section 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
