House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to insist that the United States Department of Defense take whatever action is necessary to armor American military vehicles in Iraq and Afghanistan.

WHEREAS, the security of our nation and its people is the first and foremost obligation of the Federal Government, and

WHEREAS, the men and women of our United States Armed Forces now serving in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Merchant Marine, National Guard, and Reserves have shown great courage and self-sacrifice and deserve to be equipped with the best weapons and resources to protect our nation, and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of Defense recently admitted that the military sent soldiers into harm's way without the necessary armor to protect themselves, and

WHEREAS, troops serving in Iraq are forced to rummage through Iraqi landfills in order to find materials to armor their vehicles, and

WHEREAS, the House Armed Services committee confirmed that only 75 percent of Humvees have the necessary armor, while only 10 percent of the 4,814 medium-weight transport trucks, and only 15 percent of the 4,314 heavy-weight transport vehicles are armored, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States immediately take action to require the United States Department of Defense to
