On page 5, between lines 29 and 30,

insert:

Section 3. Section 311.123, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

311.123 Maritime domain awareness training of personnel working on Florida seaports.--The Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Council, in conjunction with the Department of Law Enforcement and the Office of Drug Control within the Executive Office of the Governor, shall create a maritime domain awareness training program. The program shall provide training designed to instruct all workers within a seaport's boundaries about the security awareness procedures required of those workers in order to implement the security plan of the seaport. The training program curriculum must also include security training required pursuant to 33 C.F.R. part 105 and must be
