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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to immunizations; amending s. 400.426, F.S.; requiring assisted living facilities to implement a program to offer immunizations to residents against influenza viruses; amending s. 1003.22, F.S.; requiring each district school board and the governing authority of each private school to provide information concerning meningococcal disease and its vaccine to parents; requiring the Department of Health to adopt rules specifying the age or grade level of students for whom such information will be provided; requiring each district school board and the governing authority of each private school to determine the means and method for the provision of information regarding meningococcal disease to parents; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (13) is added to section 400.426, Florida Statutes, to read:

400.426 Appropriateness of placements; examinations of residents.--

(13) Between October 1, or earlier if the vaccination is available, and February 1 of each year, subject to the availability of an adequate supply of the necessary vaccine, each assisted living facility licensed pursuant to this part shall implement a program to offer immunizations against influenza viruses to all residents who are age 65 or older, in

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accordance with the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and subject to the clinical judgment of the responsible practitioner.

Section 2. Subsection (10) of section 1003.22, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 1003.22 School-entry health examinations; immunization against communicable diseases; exemptions; duties of Department of Health.--
- (10) Each district school board and the governing authority of each private school shall:
- (a) Refuse admittance to any child otherwise entitled to admittance to kindergarten, or any other initial entrance into a Florida public or private school, who is not in compliance with the provisions of subsection (4).
- (b) Temporarily exclude from attendance any student who is not in compliance with the provisions of subsection (4).
- (c) Provide detailed information concerning the causes, symptoms, and transmission of meningococcal disease; the risks associated with meningococcal disease; and the availability, effectiveness, and known contraindications of any required or recommended vaccine against meningococcal disease to every student's parent, in accordance with the recommended ages of students determined by the Department of Health to be appropriate for the administration of such vaccine. The Department of Health shall adopt rules that specify the age or grade level of students for whom such information shall be provided, consistent with the recommendations of the Advisory

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Committee on Immunization Practices of the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention concerning the appropriate age for the administration of the vaccine, and shall make available information concerning the causes, symptoms, and transmission of meningococcal disease; the risks associated with meningococcal disease; and the availability, effectiveness, and known contraindications of any required or recommended vaccine to school districts and the governing authorities of each private school. Each district school board and the governing authority of each private school shall determine the means and methods for the provision of such information to students' parents.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
