Section 633.115, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 14 633.115 Fire and Emergency Incident Information 15 Reporting Program; duties; fire reports.--16 17 (1) There is created the Fire and Emergency Incident Information Reporting Program within the Division of State 18 Fire Marshal. The program shall: 19 20 (a) Establish and maintain an electronic communication 21 system capable of transmitting fire and emergency incident 22 information to and between fire protection agencies. 23 (b) Initiate a fire and emergency incident information reporting system that shall be responsible for: 2.4 1. Receiving fire and emergency incident information 25 from fire protection agencies. 26 27 2. Preparing and disseminating annual reports to the 2.8 Governor, the Legislature, fire protection agencies, and, upon request, the public. Each report must include, but need not be 29 limited to, the information listed in the National Fire 30 Incident Reporting System. 31

1 Upon request, providing other states and federal 2 agencies with state fire and emergency incident data. (c) Adopt rules to effectively and efficiently 3 4 implement, administer, manage, maintain, and use the Fire and 5 Emergency Incident Information Program. The rules shall be 6 minimum requirements and do not preclude a fire protection 7 agency from implementing its own requirements that are not in conflict with the rules of the Division of State Fire Marshal. 8 9 (d) By rule, establish procedures and a format for 10 each fire protection agency to voluntarily monitor its records and submit reports to the program. 11 12 (e) Establish an electronic information database that is accessible and searchable by fire protection agencies. 13 14 The Division of State Fire Marshal shall consult with the 15 Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 16 17 Consumer Services and the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services 18 of the Department of Health to coordinate data, ensure accuracy of the data, and limit duplication of efforts in data 19 collection, analysis, and reporting. 2.0 21 (2) There is created within the Division of State Fire 2.2 Marshal the Fire and Emergency Incident Information System 23 Technical Advisory Panel. The panel shall advise, review, and make recommendations to the State Fire Marshal regarding the 2.4 requirements of this section. 25 (a) The membership of the technical advisory panel 26 27 shall consist of the following 15 members: 2.8 The current 13 members of the Firefighters Employment, Standards, and Training Council, established in s. 29 30 <u>633.31;</u> 31

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1 2. One member from the Division of Forestry, appointed 2 by the division director; and 3 3. One member from the Bureau of Emergency Medical Services, appointed by the bureau chief. 4 5 (3) As used in this section, the term "fire protection б agency" shall be defined by rule of the Division of State Fire 7 Marshal. 8 Section 2. Section 633.171, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 9 10 633.171 Penalty for violation of law, rule, or order to cease and desist or for failure to comply with corrective 11 12 order.--13 (1) <u>A person who violates</u> The violation of any provision of this law, or any order or rule of the State Fire 14 Marshal, or any order to cease and desist or to correct 15 conditions issued under this chapter commits hereunder, shall 16 17 constitute a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as 18 provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. (2) It <u>is</u> shall constitute a misdemeanor of the first 19 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, to 20 21 intentionally or willfully: 22 (a) Render a fire extinguisher or preengineered system 23 required by statute or by rule inoperative except during such time as the extinguisher or preengineered system is being 2.4 serviced, hydrotested, tested, repaired, or recharged, except 25 26 pursuant to court order. 27 (b) Obliterate the serial number on a fire 2.8 extinguisher for purposes of falsifying service records. (c) Improperly service, recharge, repair, hydrotest, 29 30 test, or inspect a fire extinguisher or preengineered system.

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           (e) Hold a permit and allow another person to use the
   said permit number.
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           (f) Use, or permit the use of, any license by any
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    individual or organization other than the one to whom the
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    license is issued.
          (3)(a) A person who initiates a pyrotechnic display in
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    an indoor facility that does not have a fire protection system
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    installed according to the Florida Fire Prevention Code and
    National Fire Protection Association Standard 13 commits a
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    felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s.
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    775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
          (b) A person who initiates a pyrotechnic display in an
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    indoor facility without the written consent of the owner or
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    operator of the indoor facility and without a permit issued by
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    the local authority having jurisdiction commits a felony of
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    the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s.
    775.083, or s. 775.084.
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          (c) This subsection does not apply to the manufacture,
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    distribution, sale at wholesale or retail, or seasonal sale of
    products regulated under chapter 791 if the products are not
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   used in an indoor facility.
           Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 633.821, Florida
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    Statutes, is amended, and subsection (6) is added to that
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    section, to read:
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           633.821 Workplace safety.--
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           (2) The division shall have the authority to adopt
   rules for the purpose of ensuring safe working conditions for
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   all firefighter employees by authorizing the enforcement of
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   effective standards, by assisting and encouraging firefighter
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1 employers to maintain safe working conditions, and by 2 providing for education and training in the field of safety. Specifically, the division may by rule adopt all or any part 3 of subparts C through T and subpart Z of 29 C.F.R. s. 1910, as 4 revised April 8, 1998; the National Fire Protection 5 6 Association, Inc., Standard 1500, paragraph 5-7 (Personal 7 Alert Safety System) (1992 edition); the latest edition of the 8 National Fire Protection Association Inc., Publication 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions, as limited by 9 10 subsection (6); and ANSI A 10.4-1990. (6)(a) The division shall adopt rules for live fire 11 12 training that all firefighters subject to this chapter must complete. The division shall also adopt rules for a training 13 and certification process for live-fire-training instructors. 14 (b) The rules for training must include: 15 Sections of the most current edition of National 16 17 Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1402, Guide to 18 Building Fire Service Training Centers, relating to 19 establishing policies and procedures for the effective use of permanent facilities or structures. 20 21 2. Sections of the most current edition of National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1403, Standard 2.2 23 on Live Fire Training Evolutions, excluding, however: a. Any chapter entitled "Referenced Publications"; 2.4 b. References to the National Fire Protection 25 Association, Inc., Publication 1975, Station Uniform; 26 27 c. The National Fire Protection Association, Inc., 2.8 Publication 1001, or any reference to this publication in the National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1975; 29 30 and 31

Any reference to an authority having jurisdiction 2 in National Fire Protection Association, Inc., Publication 1403, defined as the organization, office, or individual 3 4 responsible for approving equipment, materials, and installation, or procedures. 5 б 3. A 40-hour training program for live-fire-training 7 instructors which includes: a. Live fire instructional techniques; 8 9 b. Training safety in acquired or permanent facilities 10 or props; c. Personnel safety; and 11 12 Exterior props, including, but not limited to, 13 liquid petroleum gas, other liquid fuels, and similar props. (c) The rules, excluding those pertaining to the 14 certification of live-fire-training instructors, shall take 15 effect no later than January 1, 2006. 16 17 (d) Each live-fire-training instructor must be state-certified. 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1 (m) The Division of State Fire Marshal in the 2 Department of Financial Services, the proceeds accrued under 3 the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act shall be deposited into 4 the Insurance Regulatory Trust Fund to be used for the purposes of arson suppression, arson investigation, and the 5 6 funding of antiarson rewards. 7 Section 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 8 law. 9 10 SENATE SUMMARY 11 12 Creates the Fire and Emergency Incident Information Program in the Division of State Fire Marshal of the 13 Department of Financial Services. Provides powers and duties of the program. Creates a Fire and Emergency Incident Information System Technical Advisory Panel in 14 the division and provides for membership and duties. 15 Establishes penalties for the unauthorized use of fireworks or pyrotechnic devices in an indoor facility. Provides exceptions. Authorizes the State Fire Marshal to 16 adopt additional national fire standards to ensure safe working conditions for firefighters. Directs the State Fire Marshal to adopt rules for live fire training and 17 18 for a training and certification process for live-fire-training instructors. Requires the training and 19 certification rules to take effect by specified dates. Directs that all live fire training commenced after a specified date be conducted by a certified live-fire-training instructor. Directs that proceeds from 20 the sale of forfeited property seized by the State Fire 21 Marshal under the Florida Contraband Forfeiture Act be 22 deposited into the Insurance Regulatory Trust Fund and used for specified purposes. 23 2.4 25 26 27 28 29 30 31
