1 The Choice & Innovation Committee recommends the following: 2 3 Council/Committee Substitute 4 Remove the entire bill and insert: A bill to be entitled 5 6 An act relating to the Assistive Technology Advisory 7 Council; amending s. 413.407, F.S.; revising composition, 8 terms of service, and duties of the council; requiring the 9 Commissioner of Education to appoint members of the 10 council; deleting provision requiring the council to fund Florida's Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology; 11 12 providing an effective date. 13 14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 15 Section 413.407, Florida Statutes, is amended 16 Section 1. 17 to read: 413.407 Assistive Technology Advisory Council. -- There is 18 19 created the Assistive Technology Advisory Council, responsible 20 for ensuring consumer involvement in the creation, application, 21 and distribution of technology-related assistance to and for 22 persons who have disabilities. The council shall fulfill its 23 responsibilities through statewide policy development, both Page 1 of 7

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24	state and federal legislative initiatives, advocacy at both the
25	state and federal level, planning of statewide resource
26	allocations, policy-level management, reviews of both consumer
27	responsiveness and the adequacy of program service delivery, and
28	by performing the functions listed in this section.
29	(1)(a) The council shall be composed of:
30	1. <u>Individuals</u> Nine persons who have disabilities and who
31	are assistive technology consumers or family members or
32	guardians of those individuals.
33	2. Representatives of consumer organizations concerned
34	with assistive technology.
35	<u>3.</u> 2. Up to nine Representatives of business and industry,
36	including the insurance industry, concerned with assistive
37	technology.
38	3. Up to nine representatives of academia, community
39	agencies, and state agencies concerned with assistive
40	technology.
41	4. A representative of the Division of Vocational
42	Rehabilitation.
43	5. A representative of the Division of Blind Services.
44	6. A representative of the Independent Living Council.
45	7. A representative of Workforce Florida, Inc.
46	8. A representative of the Department of Education.
47	9. Representatives of other state agencies that provide or
48	coordinate services for persons with disabilities.

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50 Total membership on the council shall not exceed 27 at any one 51 time. <u>A majority of the members shall be appointed in accordance</u> 52 with subparagraph 1.

(b) Members of the council shall be appointed by the
<u>Commissioner of Education</u> secretary from a list of candidates
proposed by the division director.

(c) A majority of council members shall be persons who have disabilities as <u>defined</u> <del>described</del> in <u>s. 413.20(7)</u> <del>s.</del> <del>706(8)(B) of the act</del> who are also consumers of assistive technology or family members of such persons.

60 (d) The members of the council shall select two co-chairs61 from among the membership of the council.

62 1. One co-chair may be selected from the group described
63 in paragraph (c) and one co-chair shall be selected from the
64 other council members.

65 2. No co-chair may be an elected member or an employee of66 a state agency or of any political subdivision of the state.

67 (e)1. Each member of the council shall serve for a term of68 not more than 3 years, except that÷

a. a member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to
the expiration of the term for which a predecessor was appointed
shall be appointed for the remainder of such term.

72 b. The terms of service of the members shall be staggered 73 through initial appointments of 3 years for one-third, 2 years 74 for one-third, and 1 year for one-third. Each eligible group 75 described in paragraph (a) shall reflect this distribution. 76 2. No member of the council may serve more than two 77 consecutive terms; however, any appointment under subparagraph

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78 <u>1.</u> sub-subparagraph 1.a., if for less than 18 months, shall not
79 be considered a term for the purposes of this section.

3. A member who has served two consecutive terms and has
been retired from the council for at least 1 year may be
reappointed to the council on the same basis as a new member.

(f) Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy does not affect the power of the remaining members to execute the duties of the council.

87 (2) In addition to the other functions specified in this88 section, the council shall:

(a) Act as the board of directors of a not-for-profit corporation created by the division. Through the corporation, the council shall provide direction and funding to Florida's Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology, a project sponsored by the department for the coordination and delivery of appropriate, cost-effective, state-of-the-art assistive technology services and devices.

96 (b) Appoint committees made up of members of the council 97 to focus on specific issues within the council's mandate. 98 Committees may request and accept in-kind contributions of 99 personnel from public or private entities to supply such 100 staffing as the committees deem necessary to carry out their 101 individual mandates. These committees shall include, but are not 102 limited to:

 103 1. <u>An interagency</u> A committee <u>composed</u> of those members
 104 representing state agencies, <u>functioning as an interagency</u>
 105 workshop. The interagency <u>committee</u> workshop shall work towards Page 4 of 7

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106 the development of develop cooperative agreements among government agencies and perform such other duties as the council 107 108 deems appropriate. The interagency committee's workshop's 109 members shall assign staff from their respective agencies to the 110 alliance, as an in-kind contribution for a specified period of 111 time, to review federal and state legislation and agency policies and practices and to identify both facilitators of, and 112 barriers to, accessibility and utilization of assistive 113 114 technology services, devices, and funding sources.

115 2. A technology-awareness committee to <u>guide the council's</u> 116 <u>public awareness, coordination, and collaboration activities</u> 117 <del>encourage the formation of technology-awareness groups among</del> 118 <del>consumers, providers, and other interested individuals,</del> 119 <del>particularly in schools or workplaces</del>.

<u>3. A public policy and advocacy committee to review</u>
 <u>federal and state legislation and agency policies and practices</u>
 <u>and to identify facilitators of and barriers to access and</u>
 <u>utilization of assistive technology services, devices, and</u>
 <u>funding sources.</u>

125 (c) Review and approve all reports, recommendations, and126 proposed actions of committee staff.

(d) Appoint the executive director of the alliance. The executive director shall be responsible for overall administration and day-to-day direction of the alliance, as well as supervision of all staff.

(e) Annually review and approve the strategic or businessplan of the alliance, as submitted by the executive director.

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(f) Submit an annual comprehensive report of the activities of the council, the corporation, and the alliance to the division director.

(g) Perform such other functions as the council determines to be appropriate which are comparable to functions performed by the council.

(h) Convene at least four meetings each year in such places as it determines to be necessary to conduct council business and may conduct such forums or hearings as the council considers appropriate. The council shall make a report of each meeting which shall include a record of its discussions and recommendations, all of which reports shall be made available to the public.

146 (3) In accordance with Pub. L. No. 108-364, the council 147 shall:

148 (a) Investigate financing options that will increase 149 access to and funding for assistive technology devices and 150 assistive technology services.

151 (b) Develop assistive technology demonstrations,
152 reutilization programs, and loan programs.

(c) Provide training and technical assistance in order to 153 154 increase knowledge and awareness of the uses and benefits of 155 assistive technology devices and assistive technology services. 156 (d) Promote public awareness activities designed to 157 provide information relating to the benefits of assistive 158 technology devices and assistive technology services. 159 (e) Promote coordination and collaboration among public 160 and private entities that are responsible for policies,
