An act relating to the Assistive Technology Advisory Council; amending s. 413.407, F.S.; revising composition, terms of service, and duties of the council; requiring the Commissioner of Education to appoint members of the council; deleting provision requiring the council to fund Florida's Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology; providing an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 413.407, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

14 413.407 Assistive Technology Advisory Council. -- There is created the Assistive Technology Advisory Council, responsible 15 for ensuring consumer involvement in the creation, application, 16 and distribution of technology-related assistance to and for 17 persons who have disabilities. The council shall fulfill its 18 responsibilities through statewide policy development, both 19 state and federal legislative initiatives, advocacy at both the 20 21 state and federal level, planning of statewide resource allocations, policy-level management, reviews of both consumer 22 23 responsiveness and the adequacy of program service delivery, and by performing the functions listed in this section. 24

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(1) (a) The council shall be composed of:

<u>Individuals</u> Nine persons who have disabilities and who
 are assistive technology consumers or <u>family members or</u>
 guardians of those individuals.

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(d) The members of the council shall select two co-chairsfrom among the membership of the council.

One co-chair may be selected from the group described
 in paragraph (c) and one co-chair shall be selected from the
 other council members.

61 2. No co-chair may be an elected member or an employee of62 a state agency or of any political subdivision of the state.

(e)1. Each member of the council shall serve for a term ofnot more than 3 years, except that:

a. a member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to
the expiration of the term for which a predecessor was appointed
shall be appointed for the remainder of such term.

b. The terms of service of the members shall be staggered
through initial appointments of 3 years for one-third, 2 years
for one third, and 1 year for one third. Each eligible group
described in paragraph (a) shall reflect this distribution.

No member of the council may serve more than two
consecutive terms; however, any appointment under <u>subparagraph</u>
<u>1. sub-subparagraph 1.a.</u>, if for less than 18 months, shall not
be considered a term for the purposes of this section.

76 <u>3. A member who has served two consecutive terms and has</u>
77 <u>been retired from the council for at least 1 year may be</u>
78 <u>reappointed to the council on the same basis as a new member.</u>

(f) Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy does not affect the power of the remaining members to execute the duties of the council.

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83 (2) In addition to the other functions specified in this84 section, the council shall:

(a) Act as the board of directors of a not-for-profit
corporation created by the division. Through the corporation,
the council shall provide direction and funding to Florida's
Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology, a project
sponsored by the department for the coordination and delivery of
appropriate, cost-effective, state-of-the-art assistive
technology services and devices.

92 (b) Appoint committees made up of members of the council 93 to focus on specific issues within the council's mandate. 94 Committees may request and accept in-kind contributions of 95 personnel from public or private entities to supply such 96 staffing as the committees deem necessary to carry out their 97 individual mandates. These committees shall include, but are not 98 limited to:

An interagency A committee composed of those members 99 1. representing state agencies, functioning as an interagency 100 workshop. The interagency committee workshop shall work towards 101 the development of develop cooperative agreements among 102 103 government agencies and perform such other duties as the council deems appropriate. The interagency committee's workshop's 104 105 members shall assign staff from their respective agencies to the alliance, as an in-kind contribution for a specified period of 106 time, to review federal and state legislation and agency 107 policies and practices and to identify both facilitators of, and 108 barriers to, accessibility and utilization of assistive 109 110 technology services, devices, and funding sources. 144	(a) Investigate financing options that will increase
145	access to and funding for assistive technology devices and
146	assistive technology services.
147	(b) Develop assistive technology demonstrations,
148	reutilization programs, and loan programs.
149	(c) Provide training and technical assistance in order to
150	increase knowledge and awareness of the uses and benefits of
151	assistive technology devices and assistive technology services.
152	(d) Promote public awareness activities designed to
153	provide information relating to the benefits of assistive
154	technology devices and assistive technology services.
155	(e) Promote coordination and collaboration among public
156	and private entities that are responsible for policies,
157	procedures, or funding for the provision of assistive technology
158	devices and assistive technology services.
159	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
