22	or more or has been deployed by a law enforcement officer; or

24	or more that has entered the stream of interstate or

27	3. If the offender commits any grand theft and:
28	a. In the course of committing the offense the
29	offender uses a motor vehicle as an instrumentality, other
30	than merely as a getaway vehicle, to assist in committing the

In the course of committing the offense the 2 offender causes damage to the real or personal property of another in excess of \$1,000, 3 4 5 the offender commits grand theft in the first degree, 6 punishable as a felony of the first degree, as provided in s. 7 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. Section 2. Section 812.0147, Florida Statutes, is 8 created to read: 9 10 812.0147 Unlawful possession or use of a fifth 11 wheel.--12 (1) A person may not modify, alter, attempt to alter, 13 and if altered, sell, possess, offer for sale, move, or cause to be moved onto the highways of this state a device known as 14 a fifth wheel with the intent to use the fifth wheel to commit 15 or attempt to commit theft. As used in this section, the term 16 17 "fifth wheel " applies only to a fifth wheel on a heavy 18 commercial motor vehicle. (2) Any person who violates subsection (1) commits a 19 felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 20 21 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 22 Section 3.
