Immunizations.--Each applicant who has a preschool 34 414.13 35 child must begin and complete appropriate childhood 36 immunizations for the child as a condition of eligibility. At 37 the time of application and redetermination of eligibility, the 38 department shall advise applicants and participants of the availability of childhood immunizations through the county 39 40 health department. Each participant who has a preschool child must verify compliance with the section.
