Section 564.09, Florida Statutes, is 15 16 created to read: 17 564.09 Restaurants; off-premises consumption of 18 wine. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a restaurant licensed to sell wine on the premises may permit a 19 patron to remove one unsealed bottle of wine for consumption 20 21 off the premises if the patron has purchased a full-course 22 meal and consumed a portion of the bottle of wine with such 23 meal on the restaurant premises. A partially consumed bottle of wine that is to be removed from the premises must be 2.4 securely resealed by the licensee or its employees before 25 26 removal from the premises. The partially consumed bottle of 27 wine shall be placed in a bag or other container that is 2.8 secured in such a manner that it is visibly apparent if the container has been subsequently opened or tampered with, and a 29 dated receipt for the bottle of wine and full-course meal 30 shall be provided by the licensee and attached to the

1	container. If transported in a motor vehicle, the container
2	with the resealed bottle of wine must be placed in a locked
3	glove compartment, locked trunk, or other locked nonpassenger
4	area of the motor vehicle.

9	(9) A bottle of wine that has been resealed pursuant

15	SENATE SUMMARY
16	Authorizes a restaurant patron to remove a resealed wine
17	container from a restaurant for off-premise consumption. Provides that a resealed wine container is not an open
18	container for purposes of s. 316.1936, F. S., relating to the unlawful possession of an open container of an
19	alcoholic beverage in a vehicle.
