A bill to be entitled

An act relating to career education; amending s. 1003.491, F.S.; providing for accountability for career education in middle schools in the school districts; requiring school district plans for providing career education courses; amending s. 1006.02, F.S.; requiring documentation of career counseling to middle and high school students; amending s. 1006.025, F.S.; requiring training of guidance counselors and career specialists relating to career education; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 1003.491, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

School board, superintendent, and school

1003.491 Career education.--

accountability for career education within elementary, middle, and secondary schools includes, but is not limited to:

(a) Student exposure to a variety of careers and provision of instruction to explore specific careers in greater depth.

(b) Student awareness of available career programs and the corresponding occupations into which such programs lead <a href="through">through</a> advisement by guidance counselors and career specialists.

(c) Student development of individual career plans.

(d) Integration of academic and career skills in the middle school and high school secondary curriculum.

(e) Student preparation to enter the workforce and enroll in postsecondary education without being required to complete college preparatory or career preparatory instruction.

- (f) Student retention in school through high school graduation.
- (g) Career education curriculum articulation with corresponding postsecondary programs in the career center or community college, or both.

- Each district school board shall develop a plan for providing career education courses in the middle schools and high schools of the school district.
- Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 1006.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 1006.02 Provision of information to students and parents regarding school-to-work transition.--
- (1) All public K-12 schools shall document the manner in which they have prepared students to enter the workforce, including information regarding the provision of accurate, timely career and curricular counseling to middle and high school students. This information shall include a delineation of available career opportunities, educational requirements associated with each career, educational institutions that prepare students to enter each career, and student financial aid available to enable students to pursue any postsecondary instruction required to enter that career. This information shall also delineate school procedures for identifying individual student interests and aptitudes which enable students

to make informed decisions about the curriculum that best addresses their individual interests and aptitudes while preparing them to enroll in postsecondary education and enter the workforce. This information shall include recommended high school coursework that prepares students for success in college-level work. The information shall be made known to parents and students annually through inclusion in the school's handbook, manual, or similar documents or other communications regularly provided to parents and students.

Section 3. Section 1006.025, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1006.025 Guidance services.--

- (1) (a) Each district school board shall annually submit a district guidance report to the Commissioner of Education by June 30.
- $\underline{\text{(b)}(2)}$  The guidance report shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
- $\frac{1.(a)}{a}$  Examination of student access to guidance counselors.
- 2.(b) Degree to which a district has adopted or implemented a guidance model program.
- 3.(c) Evaluation of the information and training available to guidance counselors and career specialists to advise students on areas of critical need, labor market trends, and technical training requirements.
- $\underline{4.(d)}$  Progress toward incorporation of best practices for advisement as identified by the department.

5.(e) Consideration of alternative guidance systems or ideas, including, but not limited to, a teacher-advisor model, mentoring, partnerships with the business community, web-based delivery, and parental involvement.

- $\underline{6.(f)}$  Actions taken to provide information to students for the school-to-work transition pursuant to s. 1006.02.
  - 7.(g) A guidance plan for the district.

- (c)(3) The department shall provide resources to district school boards that may assist districts in preparing the annual guidance report. The resources shall include, but are not limited to, materials relating to guidance model programs, training available through the department for career guidance, adopted best practices, alternative guidance systems or ideas, and a model district guidance plan.
- (2) Each district school board shall provide for training of guidance counselors and career specialists to advise students in the area of career education choices in order to develop individual career education plans for middle school, high school, and postsecondary education or employment.
- Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
