24	Attorney General and shall consist of 21 members appointed
25	within 30 days of the effective date of this act as follows:
26	(a) Two members of the Senate who are not members of the
27	same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate
28	with the advice of the minority leader of the Senate.

29	(b) Two members of the House of Representatives who are

62	(2) A member of the commission may be removed at any time
63	by the member's appointing authority who shall fill the vacancy

82	(d) The commission shall receive suggestions or comments

The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staff 86 (5) 87 and administrative support to the commission. 88 The commission shall meet quarterly and at other times (6) 89 at the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of 90 commission members. 91 Ten of the members of the commission shall constitute (7) 92 a quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members 93 present is required for final action. (8) The commission shall issue its first annual report by 94 95 December 15, 2006, and by December 15 each following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the 96 commission. The commission shall submit the report to the 97 98 Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House 99 of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing 100 committees of jurisdiction in each chamber. 101 (9) Members of the commission shall serve without compensation, but members who are not government employees are 102 103 entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as 104 provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes. 105 (10) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Attorney General 106 shall: 107 (a) Within 60 days after the effective date of this act, 108 fix a date for the initial meeting of the commission. 109 (b) Notify each member of the commission of the time, 110 date, and place where the initial meeting will be held. 111 (c) Make any other arrangements concerning the initial 112 meeting of the commission.

115	(11) This section expires July 1, 2011, unless reenacted

117	Section 2. The sum of \$50,000 is appropriated from the
118	General Revenue Fund to the Commission on the Social Status of
119	African American Men and Boys for the purpose of administering

121	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
