An act relating to the social status of African American men and boys; creating the Commission on the Social Status of African American Men and Boys; providing for the appointment and qualification of members; providing for the appointment of members to fill vacant positions; requiring the commission to make a systematic study of conditions affecting African American men and boys; requiring the Office of the Attorney General to provide administrative support; requiring the commission to submit an annual report to the Governor and Legislature; providing for reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses; requiring the Attorney General to organize the initial meeting of the commission; providing for the expiration of the commission; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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23 Section 1. Commission on the Social Status of African 24 American Men and Boys. --25 (1) The Commission on the Social Status of African 26 American Men and Boys is established in the Office of the 27 Attorney General and shall consist of 21 members appointed 28 within 30 days of the effective date of this act as follows: Two members of the Senate who are not members of the 29 same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate 30 with the advice of the minority leader of the Senate. 31 32 Two members of the House of Representatives who are 33 not members of the same political party, appointed by the 34 Speaker of the House of Representatives with the advice of the 35 minority leader of the House of Representatives. 36 The Secretary of Children and Family Services or his 37 or her designee. 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(1) Two persons appointed by the President of the Senate who are not members of the Legislature or employed by state government.

- (m) Two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives who are not members of the Legislature or employed by state government.
- (n) The deputy secretary for Medicaid in the Agency for Health Care Administration or his or her designee.
- (o) The director of the Office of Economic and Demographic Research or his or her designee.
- (p) The Secretary of Juvenile Justice or his or her designee.
- (q) The director of the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability or his or her designee.
- (2) A member of the commission may be removed at any time by the member's appointing authority who shall fill the vacancy on the commission.
- (3)(a) At the first meeting of the commission each year, the members shall elect a chair and a vice chair.
- (b) A vacancy in the office of chair or vice chair shall be filled by vote of the remaining members.
- (4)(a) The commission shall make a systematic study of the conditions affecting African American men and boys, including, but not limited to, the homicide rates, arrest and incarceration rates, poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate annual income levels, school performance in all grade levels including postsecondary levels, and health issues.

(b) The commission shall propose measures to alleviate and correct the underlying causes of the conditions described in paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to the law or systematic changes that can be implemented without legislative action.

- (c) The commission may study other topics suggested by the Legislature or as directed by the chair of the commission.
- (d) The commission shall receive suggestions or comments pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private organizations, and private citizens.
- (5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staff and administrative support to the commission.
- (6) The commission shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of commission members.
- (7) Ten of the members of the commission shall constitute a quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members present is required for final action.
- (8) The commission shall issue its first annual report by December 15, 2006, and by December 15 each following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the commission. The commission shall submit the report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing committees of jurisdiction in each chamber.
