25	(1) The Council on the Social Status of African-American
26	Men and Boys is established and shall consist of 19 members
27	appointed as follows:
28	(a) Two members of the Senate who are not members of the
29	same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate
30	with the advice of the minority leader of the Senate.
31	(b) Two members of the House of Representatives who are
32	not members of the same political party, appointed by the

One of the appointees must be a clinical 52 53 physiologist. 54 (m) Two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of 55 Representatives who are not members of the Legislature or 56 employed by state government. (c) The council may study other topics suggested by the 80 81 Legislature or as directed by the chair of the council. 82 (d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments 83 pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private 84 85 organizations, and private citizens. (5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staff 86 87 and administrative support to the council. 88 The council shall meet quarterly and at other times at (6) 89 the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of council 90 members. 91 (7) Ten of the members of the council shall constitute a 92 quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members 93 present is required for final action. 94 (8) The council shall issue its first annual report by 95 December 15, 2006, and by December 15 each following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the 96 council. The council shall submit the report to the Governor, 97 98 the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of 99 Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing committees 100 of jurisdiction in each chamber. 101 (9) Members of the council shall serve without 102 compensation, but members who are not government employees are 103 entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as 104 provided in s. 112.061, Florida Statutes.
