61 It is declared to be the policy of the state to (1)62 provide educational opportunity at state expense for the dependent children of those military personnel who die or suffer 63 64 a service-connected 100-percent total and permanent disability 65 rating for compensation as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, or who are determined 66 67 to have a service-connected total and permanent disability 68 rating of 100 percent and are in receipt of disability retirement pay from any branch of the United States Armed 69 70 Services, while participating in Operation Enduring Freedom, 71 which began on October 7, 2001, or while participating in Operation Iraqi Freedom, which began on March 19, 2003, if such 72 73 military personnel have been residents of the state during the 74 period of military action. 86 Section 3. Section 295.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to 87 read:

295.02 Use of funds; age, etc.--All sums appropriated and 88 89 expended under this chapter shall be used to pay tuition and 90 registration fees, board, and room rent and to buy books and 91 supplies for the children of deceased or disabled veterans or 92 service members, as defined and limited in s. 295.01, s. 295.016, s. 295.017, s. 295.018, s. 295.0185, or s. 295.0195, or 93 of parents classified as prisoners of war or missing in action, 94 95 as defined and limited in s. 295.015, who are between the ages 96 of 16 and 22 years and who are in attendance at a statesupported institution of higher learning, including a community 97 98 college or career center. Any child having entered upon a course of training or education under the provisions of this chapter, 99 consisting of a course of not more than 4 years, and arriving at 100 101 the age of 22 years before the completion of such course may continue the course and receive all benefits of the provisions 102 103 of this chapter until the course is completed. The Department of Education shall administer this educational program subject to 104 105 regulations of the department.

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Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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
