55 (1)It is declared to be the policy of the state to provide educational opportunity at state expense for the 56 dependent children of those military personnel who die or suffer 57 a service-connected 100-percent total and permanent disability 58 59 rating for compensation as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, or who are determined 60 to have a service-connected total and permanent disability 61 62 rating of 100 percent and are in receipt of disability retirement pay from any branch of the United States Armed 63 Services, while participating in Operation Enduring Freedom, 64 which began on October 7, 2001, or while participating in 65 66 Operation Iraqi Freedom, which began on March 19, 2003, if such military personnel have been residents of the state during the 67 68 period of military action. 82 295.02 Use of funds; age, etc.--All sums appropriated and expended under this chapter shall be used to pay tuition and 83 registration fees, board, and room rent and to buy books and 84 85 supplies for the children of deceased or disabled veterans or 86 service members, as defined and limited in s. 295.01, s. 295.016, s. 295.017, s. 295.018, s. 295.0185, or s. 295.0195, or 87 of parents classified as prisoners of war or missing in action, 88 as defined and limited in s. 295.015, who are between the ages 89 of 16 and 22 years and who are in attendance at a state-90 supported institution of higher learning, including a community 91 92 college or career center. Any child having entered upon a course 93 of training or education under the provisions of this chapter, consisting of a course of not more than 4 years, and arriving at 94 95 the age of 22 years before the completion of such course may continue the course and receive all benefits of the provisions 96 of this chapter until the course is completed.
