Subsection (4) of section 1006.07, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 1006.07 District school board duties relating to 15 student discipline and school safety .-- The district school 16 17 board shall provide for the proper accounting for all 18 students, for the attendance and control of students at school, and for proper attention to health, safety, and other 19 matters relating to the welfare of students, including: 20 (4) EMERGENCY DRILLS; EMERGENCY PROCEDURES.--21 22 (a) Formulate and prescribe policies and procedures 23 for emergency preparation and drill activities drills and for emergency response and management, including incidents or 2.4 events resulting from violence, technological malfunction or 25 26 human error, and natural disaster actual emergencies, 27 including, but not limited to, fires, natural disasters, and 2.8 bomb threats, for all the public schools of the district which 29 comprise grades K-12. District school board policies must shall include commonly used alarm system responses for 30 specific types of emergencies and verification by each school 31

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1 that drills have been provided as required by law and fire 2 protection codes. Each school shall conduct and document at least 10 emergency drills per school year, at least five of 3 which must be emergency eqress drills, at least one of which 4 must be an accidental or intentional hazardous material 5 6 release drill, and at least two of which must be tornado 7 drills. The focus of the two remaining emergency drills shall 8 be at the discretion of each school. 9 The district school board shall establish model (b) 10 emergency management and emergency preparedness procedures for 11 the following life-threatening emergencies: 12 Manmade emergencies, including fires, bomb threats, 1. 13 and weapon-use and hostage situations. 2. Technological emergencies, including radiological, 14 hazardous materials, or toxic chemical releases spills. 15 16 3. Weather emergencies, including hurricanes, 17 tornadoes, and severe storms. 18 4 Exposure as a result of a manmade emergency. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005. 19 20 21 STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR 2.2 Senate Bill 1228 23 The bill amends s. 1006.07(4), F.S., to revise district school 2.4 board responsibilities to include emergency preparation and 25 including incidents or events resulting from violence, technological malfunction or human error, and natural 26 disaster. The bill requires at least 10 emergency drills per school year and specifies the types of drills that must be conducted and 27 documented by each school: Five emergency egress drills; one 2.8 accidental or intentional hazardous material release drill; 29 two tornado drills; and two drills at the discretion of each school. In addition, the bill redefines the areas of 30 life-threatening emergencies for which the board must establish model procedures to include manmade emergencies, including fires and bomb threats and technological 31 emergencies, including radiological releases.

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
