In accordance with these findings, the Department of Children and Family Services shall establish a 3 4 3-year pilot program in Sarasota, Desoto, Manatee, Pinellas, and Pasco Counties to pay a portion of the cost of motor 5 6 vehicle insurance for foster children who have obtained a 7 driver's license.
