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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to older adults and the criminal justice system; creating a workgroup to study the involvement of older adults with the criminal justice system; providing requirements for the study; providing membership; authorizing reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses; requiring a report; providing for dissolution of the workgroup; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- (1) WORKGROUP. -- The Department of Elderly Section 1. Affairs shall establish a workgroup to study the involvement of older adults age 60 and over with the criminal justice system, with particular emphasis on older adults age 70 and over. The study shall:
- Determine the extent to which crimes committed by older adults result in arrest and the impact of arrest on older adults and on state law enforcement and the criminal justice system.
- (b) Examine the incidence of and issues surrounding older adults with dementia or other mental health or health conditions and determine how these conditions affect their involvement with the criminal justice system.
- (c) Determine the extent to which current programs, including, but not limited to, the community and forensic mental health, substance abuse, and domestic violence systems, and

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specialty courts are addressing the issues experienced by older adults involved in the criminal justice system.

- (d) Determine the unmet health, mental health, and other social service needs of individuals who are arrested that, if met, would result in the reduced arrest or incarceration of these individuals as well as reduced recidivism.
- (e) Determine the state's current capacity to provide for early identification of older adults who are arrested who have significant medical issues or mental health conditions and its current ability to respond in a meaningful and timely manner to these issues.
- (f) Identify the services and best practices that, if implemented, would ensure the early identification, assessment, treatment, and diversion of older adults who are arrested and ensure more effective use of available resources.
- (g) Specify, to the extent possible, the costs associated with such services and best practices that are identified by the workgroup.
 - (2) MEMBERSHIP.--

- (a) The workgroup shall consist of at least the following 10 members:
- 1. The secretary of the Department of Elderly Affairs, or his or her designee.
- 2. The secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services, or his or her designee.
- 3. The executive director of the Department of Law Enforcement, or his or her designee.
 - 4. A representative from the Florida Sheriffs Association.

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5. The president of the Florida Police Chiefs Association, or his or her designee.

6. A representative from the Office of the State Courts
Administrator.

- 7. A physician with experience with geriatric populations, appointed by the secretary of the Department of Elderly Affairs.
- 8. An expert on the mental health of older adults, appointed by the secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services.
- 9. An expert on aging and legal issues, appointed by The Florida Bar.
- 10. A member of the judiciary, appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.
- (b) Any member of the workgroup may receive reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061,

 Florida Statutes.
- (c) The secretary of the Department of Elderly Affairs, or his or her designee, shall serve as the chairperson of the workgroup and provide for the support of the workgroup.
- (3) REPORT.--The Department of Elderly Affairs shall prepare and submit a report to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the appropriate substantive committees no later than January 31, 2006. The report must address the findings of the workgroup as specified in subsection (1).
- (4) DISSOLUTION. -- The workgroup is dissolved upon submission of its report.
 - Section 2. The sum of \$200,000 is appropriated from the
