A bill to be entitled

An act relating to beach safety; amending s. 380.276, F.S.; revising the provisions for the placement of uniform warning and safety flags at public beaches; prohibiting the display of flags not specifically developed by the Department of Environmental Protection; revising liability provisions; authorizing the department to develop and distribute information and materials related to beach safety; providing an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 380.276, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

15 380.276 Beaches and coastal areas; display of uniform 16 warning and safety flags <u>at</u> on public beaches; placement of 17 uniform notification signs; beach safety education.--

It is the intent of the Legislature that a cooperative 18 (1)effort among state agencies and local governments be undertaken 19 to plan for and assist in the display of uniform warning and 20 21 safety flags, and the placement of uniform notification signs 22 that provide the meaning of such warning and safety flags, at on 23 the public beaches along the coast of the state. Because the varying natural conditions of Florida's public beaches and 24 coastal areas pose significant risks to the safety of tourists 25 and the general public, it is important to inform the public of 26 27 the need to exercise caution.

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28 (2)The Department of Environmental Protection, through the Florida Coastal Management Program, shall direct and 29 coordinate the uniform warning and safety flag program. The 30 purpose of the program shall be to encourage the display of 31 32 uniform warning and safety flags at all public beaches along the coast of the state at which warning and safety flags are 33 displayed and lifeguards are on duty, and to encourage the 34 placement of uniform notification signs that provide the meaning 35 of such flags. Only warning and safety flags developed by the 36 department shall be displayed. Participation in the program 37 38 shall be open to any government having jurisdiction over a public beach along the coast, whether or not the beach has 39 lifequards. 40 41 (3) The Department of Environmental Protection shall develop a program for the display of uniform warning and safety 42 flags at all public beaches along the coast of the state at 43

which warning and safety flags are displayed and lifeguards are on duty, and for the placement of uniform notification signs 45 that provide the meaning of the flags displayed. Such a program 46 shall provide: 47

(a) For posted notification of the meaning of each of the 48 warning and safety flags at all designated public access points. 49

That uniform notification signs be posted in a 50 (b) conspicuous location and be clearly legible. 51

A standard size, shape, color, and definition for each 52 (C) warning and safety flag. 53

(d) That flags incorporate a numerical designation to 54 55 accommodate persons who are colorblind. Page 2 of 4

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56 (e) That flags not specifically defined by the department 57 must be identified by the entity displaying the flags in the 58 posted notification. 59 (f) Guidelines for the periodic replacement of flags.

60 The Department of Environmental Protection is (4)authorized, within the limits of appropriations or grants 61 available to it for such purposes, to establish and operate a 62 program to encourage the display of uniform warning and safety 63 flags at on all public beaches along the coast of the state and 64 65 to encourage the placement of uniform notification signs that provide the meaning of the flags displayed. The department shall 66 coordinate the implementation of the uniform warning and safety 67 68 flag program with local governing bodies and the Florida Beach 69 Patrol Chiefs Association.

(5) The Department of Environmental Protection may adopt
rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 necessary to
administer this section.

Due to the inherent danger of constantly changing surf 73 (6) 74 and other naturally occurring conditions along Florida's coast, 75 the state, state agencies, local and regional government 76 entities or authorities, and their individual employees and 77 agents, shall governments, and local government agencies may not 78 be held liable for any injury or loss of life caused by changing surf and other naturally occurring conditions along coastal 79 areas, whether or not uniform warning and safety flags or 80 notification signs developed by the department are displayed or 81 posted the reasonable placement or location of uniform warning 82 83 and safety flags or reasonably posted uniform notification signs Page 3 of 4

84	or the failure to install uniform warning and safety flags or
85	posted uniform notification signs as provided by this section.
86	(7) The Department of Environmental Protection, through
87	the Florida Coastal Management Program, may also develop and
88	make available to the public other educational information and
89	materials related to beach safety.
90	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
