Section 401.2915, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 401.2915 Automated external defibrillators.--It is the 15 intent of the Legislature that an automated external 16 17 defibrillator may be used by any person for the purpose of saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest. In order 18 to ensure public health and safety: 19 (1) All persons who use an automated external 20 21 defibrillator must obtain appropriate training, to include 22 completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or 23 successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and 2.4 demonstrated proficiency in the use of an automated external 25 defibrillator.+ 26 27 (2) Any person or entity in possession of an automated 2.8 external defibrillator is encouraged to register with the 29 local emergency medical services medical director the existence and location of the automated external 30 defibrillator.; and 31 1

1 (3) Any person who uses an automated external 2 defibrillator shall is required to activate the emergency medical services system as soon as possible upon use of the 3 automated external defibrillator. 4 5 (4) Each local and state law enforcement vehicle may б carry an automated external defibrillator. 7 Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 932.7055, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 8 932.7055 Disposition of liens and forfeited 9 10 property.--(5)(a) If the seizing agency is a county or municipal 11 12 agency, the remaining proceeds shall be deposited in a special 13 law enforcement trust fund established by the board of county commissioners or the governing body of the municipality. Such 14 proceeds and interest earned therefrom shall be used for 15 school resource officer, crime prevention, safe neighborhood, 16 17 drug abuse education and prevention programs, or for other law enforcement purposes, which include defraying the cost of 18 protracted or complex investigations, providing additional 19 equipment or expertise, purchasing automated external 20 21 defibrillators for use in law enforcement vehicles, and 22 providing matching funds to obtain federal grants.
