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23	Section 1. Section 295.01, Florida Statutes, is

27	(1) It is hereby declared to be the policy of the
28	state to provide educational opportunity at state expense for
29	dependent children either of whose parents was a resident of
30	the state at the time such parent entered the Armed Forces
31	and:

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1 (a) Died as a result of service-connected injuries, 2 disease, or disability sustained while on active duty; or 3 (b) Has been: 4 1. Determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or its predecessor to have a 5 6 service-connected 100-percent total and permanent disability 7 rating for compensation; 2. Determined to have a service-connected total and 8 permanent disability rating of 100 percent and is in receipt 9 of disability retirement pay from any branch of the United 10 States Armed Services; or 11 12 3. Issued a valid identification card by the 13 Department of Veterans' Affairs in accordance with s. 295.17, 14 when the parents of such children have been bona fide 15 residents of the state for 1 year immediately 5 years next 16 preceding the death or occurrence of such disability their 17 18 application for the benefits hereof, and subject to the rules, restrictions, and limitations set forth in this section 19 hereof. 20 21 (2) <u>Sections</u> The provisions of ss. 295.03, 295.04, 22 295.05, and 1009.40 shall apply. 23 (3) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for administering this section. 2.4 25 Section 2. 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1 dependent children of those military personnel who die or 2 suffer a service-connected 100-percent total and permanent disability rating for compensation as determined by the United 3 States Department of Veterans Affairs, or who are determined 4 to have a service-connected total and permanent disability 5 6 rating of 100 percent and are in receipt of disability 7 retirement pay from any branch of the United States Armed 8 Services, while participating in Operation Enduring Freedom, which began on October 7, 2001, or while participating in 9 Operation Iraqi Freedom, which began on March 19, 2003, if 10 such military personnel have been residents of the state 11 12 during the period of military action. A certified copy of a 13 death certificate, a valid identification card issued in accordance with the provisions of s. 295.17, a letter 14 certifying the service-connected 100-percent total and 15 permanent disability rating for compensation from the United 16 17 States Department of Veterans Affairs, or a letter certifying 18 the service-connected total and permanent disability rating of 100 percent for retirement pay from any branch of the United 19 States Armed Services is prima facie evidence that the 20 21 dependent children of such military personnel are eligible for 22 educational benefits. 23 (2) The provisions of ss. 295.03, 295.04, 295.05, and 1009.40 apply. 24 Section 3. The CS revises program eligibility 2.0 requirements to eliminate the requirement that the deceased or disabled veteran must have been a Florida resident at the time 21 of entry into Armed Forces. 22 The CS extends Program eligibility to the dependents of 23 veterans who die or are disabled while serving in Operation Iraqi Freedom. 2.4 25 26 27 2.8 29 30 31

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
