(c) Each member of the commission shall represent the 21 22 needs of the transportation disadvantaged throughout the state. 23 A member may not subordinate the needs of the transportation 24 disadvantaged in general in order to favor the needs of others 25 residing in a specific location in the state. 26 (d) Each person appointed to the board of the commission 27 shall serve a term of 4 years. A member may be reappointed for 28 one additional 4-year term. 29 (e) A member must be a citizen of the state and a 30 registered voter. 31 (f) The Secretary of Transportation, the Secretary of Children and Family Services, the director of Workforce 32 33 Innovation, the executive director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs, the Secretary of Elderly Affairs, the 34 Secretary of Health Care Administration, the director of the 35 Agency for Persons with Disabilities, and an elected official of 36 37 local government who is appointed by the Governor, or a designee 38 of each, respectively, shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting 39 advisors to the commission. 40 (g) A person appointed to the board of the commission may not, within the 5 years immediately before the appointment, or 41 during his or her term on the board, has or had a financial 42 331691

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Amendment No. (for drafter's use only) 94 (o) Two representatives of current private for-profit or 95 private not-for-profit transportation operators each of which have a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience operating a 96 97 broad-based system of ambulatory and wheelchair/stretcher type 98 transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles and 99 including dispatch and scheduling responsibilities. Such persons 100 shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a 101 term of 4 years. 102 (p) Four representatives of current private for-profit or 103 private not-for-profit transportation operators, each of which having a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience operating a 104 105 broad-based system of ambulatory and wheelchair or stretchertype transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles, and 106 107 including dispatch and scheduling responsibilities. Such persons shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a 108 109 term of 4 years. (q) Six citizens representing the nontransportation 110 business community of the state, three members appointed by the 111 President of the Senate and three members appointed by the 112 Speaker of the House of Representatives. 113 114 The chairperson shall be appointed by the Governor and (2) vice chairperson of the commission shall be elected annually 115 116 from the membership of the commission. Members of the commission shall serve without 117 (3) 118 compensation but shall be allowed per diem and travel expenses, as provided in s. 112.061. 119

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120 (4) The commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more 121 frequently at the call of the chairperson. Five Nine members of the commission constitute a quorum, and a majority vote of the 122 123 members present is necessary for any action taken by the 124 commission.

125 (5) The Governor may remove any member of the commission 126 for cause.

127 (6) Each candidate for appointment to the commission must, 128 before accepting the appointment, undergo background screening under s. 435.04, by filing with the Department of Transportation 129 130 a complete set of fingerprints taken by an authorized law enforcement agency. The fingerprints must be submitted to the 131 132 Department of Law Enforcement for state processing, and that department shall submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau 133 of Investigation for federal processing. The Department of 134 135 Transportation shall screen the background results and inform 136 the commission if any candidate failed to meet level 2 screening 137 standards. A candidate found to have failed to meet level 2 screening standards may not be appointed to the commission. The 138 cost of the background screening may be borne by the Department 139 140 of Transportation or the candidate for appointment to the 141 commission.

142 (7) (6) The commission shall appoint an executive director who shall serve under the direction, supervision, and control of 143 144 the commission. The executive director, with the consent of the 145 commission, shall employ such personnel as may be necessary to 146 perform adequately the functions of the commission within

(8) The commission shall appoint at least four technical 149 150 advisory committees to advise the commission on issues of importance to the state and to regions of the state. 151 152 (a) One technical advisory committee shall provide 153 information, advice, and direction to the commission on the 154 coordination of services for the transportation disadvantaged. 155 Its membership shall include, but need not be limited to, 156 representatives of community transportation coordinators and 157 private paratransit providers. (b) One technical advisory committee shall provide 158 information, advice, and direction to the commission on the 159 160 transportation planning issues affecting the transportation disadvantaged program. Its membership may include, but need not 161 162 be limited to, representatives of metropolitan planning 163 organizations and regional planning councils. (c) One technical advisory committee shall provide 164 information, advice, and direction to the commission on 165 business-related issues affecting the transportation 166 167 disadvantaged program. Its membership may include, but need not be limited to, persons with expertise in insurance, marketing, 168 169 economic development, or financial planning. 170 (d) One technical advisory committee shall be a forum for 171 users of the transportation disadvantaged system. Its membership 172 may include, but need not be limited to, direct users of the system and representatives of the users, such as parents and 173 331691

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other relatives, guardians, and service professionals who tend 174

175 to the needs of persons who are transportationally

177 (e) The commission may establish the size, composition, and focus of any technical advisory committee it creates. A 178 179 member appointed to a technical advisory committee shall serve 180 without compensation and without per diem.

181 (9) (7) The commission is assigned to the office of the 182 secretary of the Department of Transportation for administrative and fiscal accountability purposes, but it shall otherwise 183 184 function independently of the control, supervision, and 185 direction of the department.

186 (10) (10) (8) The commission shall develop a budget under 187 pursuant to chapter 216. The budget is not subject to change by the department staff after it has been approved by the 188 189 commission, but it shall be transmitted to the Governor, as head of the department, along with the budget of the department. 190

191 (11)(a) No later than 30 days after the Governor issues his executive budget recommendations, the commission shall 192 present to the Legislative Budget Commission a proposed formula 193 194 for allocating the transportation funds that the commission 195 anticipates receiving from the General Appropriations Act for 196 the next fiscal year. The document must specifically detail the 197 amount of funding expected to be allocated to each county for 198 transportation disadvantaged services. The Legislative Budget 199 Commission shall approve, reject, or request modifications to

Section 2. Subsection (12) of section 427.013, Florida 211 212 Statutes, is amended to read: 427.013 The Commission for the Transportation 213 214 Disadvantaged; purpose and responsibilities.--The purpose of the 215 commission is to accomplish the coordination of transportation 216 services provided to the transportation disadvantaged. The goal 217 of this coordination shall be to assure the cost-effective provision of transportation by qualified community 218 219 transportation coordinators or transportation operators for the 220 transportation disadvantaged without any bias or presumption in 221 favor of multioperator systems or not-for-profit transportation 222 operators over single operator systems or for-profit 223 transportation operators. In carrying out this purpose, the 224 commission shall: 225 (12)(a) Have the authority to apply for and accept funds, 226 grants, gifts, and services from the Federal Government, state

Funds 229 230 acquired or accepted under this subsection shall be administered 231 by the commission and shall be used to carry out the 232 commission's responsibilities. 233 (b) Develop an allocation methodology or formula that 234 equitably distributes the funds under the control of the 235 commission to compensate counties, community transportation 236 coordinators, or other entities providing transportation 237 disadvantaged services. The formula shall take into account not 238 only the actual costs of each transportation disadvantaged trip but also those efficiencies that a provider might adopt to 239 reduce costs, including cost efficiencies of trips when compared 240 241 to the local cost of transporting the general public. 2.4.2 Section 3.
