17	Section 1. Section 1006.15, Florida Statutes, is
18	amended to read:
19	1006.15 Student standards for participation in
20	interscholastic extracurricular student activities;
21	regulation
22	(1) This section may be cited as the "Craig Dickinson
23	Act."
24	(2) Interscholastic Extracurricular student activities
25	are an important complement to the academic curriculum.
26	Participation in a comprehensive extracurricular and academic
27	program contributes to student development of the social and
28	intellectual skills necessary to become a well-rounded adult.
29	As used in this section, the term "extracurricular" means any
30	school-authorized or education-related activity, including,
31	but not limited to, interscholastic activities, occurring
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during or outside the regular instructional school day. For purposes of this section, a student may not be precluded from 2 receiving tutoring, performing community service, or attending 3 school athletic, social, and academic functions. However, a student who is not eligible, pursuant to this section, to 5 participate in extracurricular activities may not perform at 7 school functions or travel with a school team, band, club, or other organization to any event where the group is to compete 8 or perform. This section does not prohibit a student who is 10 enrolled in a class designated by the student course code 11 directory provided by the Department of Education from performing or traveling to compete or perform as part of the 12 13 class curriculum.

- (3)(a) To be eligible to participate in interscholastic extracurricular student activities in athletics, a student must:
- 1. Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the previous semester or a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1).
- 2. Execute and fulfill the requirements of an academic performance contract between the student, the district school board, the appropriate governing association, and the student's parents, if the student's cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0, or its equivalent, on a 4.0 scale in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1) or, for students who entered the 9th grade prior to the 1997-1998 school year, if the student's cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1) that are taken after July 1, 1997. At a minimum, the contract must require that the student attend summer

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school, or its graded equivalent, between grades 9 and 10 or grades 10 and 11, as necessary.

- 3. Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1) during his or her junior or senior year.
- 4. Maintain satisfactory conduct and, if a student is convicted of, or is found to have committed, a felony or a delinquent act which would have been a felony if committed by an adult, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, the student's participation in interscholastic extracurricular activities is contingent upon established and published district school board policy.
- (b) Any student who is exempt from attending a full school day based on rules adopted by the district school board for double session schools or programs, experimental schools, or schools operating under emergency conditions must maintain the grade point average required by this section and pass each class for which he or she is enrolled. The establishment and approval of the waiver process pursuant to paragraph (e) shall apply to the requirements of this paragraph.
- (c) An individual home education student is eligible to participate at the public school to which the student would be assigned according to district school board attendance area policies or which the student could choose to attend pursuant to district or interdistrict controlled open enrollment provisions, or may develop an agreement to participate at a private school, in the interscholastic extracurricular activities of that school, provided the following conditions are met:
 - 1. The home education student must meet the

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requirements of the home education program pursuant to s. 1002.41.

- 2. During the period of participation at a school, the home education student must demonstrate educational progress as required in paragraph (b) in all subjects taken in the home education program by a method of evaluation agreed upon by the parent and the school principal which may include: review of the student's work by a certified teacher chosen by the parent; grades earned through correspondence; grades earned in courses taken at a community college, university, or trade school; standardized test scores above the 35th percentile; or any other method designated in s. 1002.41.
- 3. The home education student must meet the same residency requirements as other students in the school at which he or she participates.
- 4. The home education student must meet the same standards of acceptance, behavior, and performance as required of other students in extracurricular activities.
- 5. The student must register with the school his or her intent to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities as a representative of the school before the beginning date of the season for the activity in which he or she wishes to participate. A home education student must be able to participate in curricular activities if that is a requirement for an extracurricular activity.
- 6. A student who transfers from a home education program to a public school before or during the first grading period of the school year is academically eligible to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities during the first grading period provided the student has a successful evaluation from the previous school year, pursuant

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l to subparagraph 2.

- 7. Any public school or private school student who has been unable to maintain academic eligibility for participation in interscholastic extracurricular activities is ineligible to participate in such activities as a home education student until the student has successfully completed one grading period in home education pursuant to subparagraph 2. to become eligible to participate as a home education student.
- (d) An individual charter school student pursuant to s. 1002.33 is eligible to participate at the public school to which the student would be assigned according to district school board attendance area policies or which the student could choose to attend, pursuant to district or interdistrict controlled open-enrollment provisions, in any interscholastic extracurricular activity of that school, unless such activity is provided by the student's charter school, if the following conditions are met:
- 1. The charter school student must meet the requirements of the charter school education program as determined by the charter school governing board.
- 2. During the period of participation at a school, the charter school student must demonstrate educational progress as required in paragraph (b).
- 3. The charter school student must meet the same residency requirements as other students in the school at which he or she participates.
- 4. The charter school student must meet the same standards of acceptance, behavior, and performance that are required of other students in extracurricular activities.
- 5. The charter school student must register with the school his or her intent to participate in interscholastic

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extracurricular activities as a representative of the school before the beginning date of the season for the activity in which he or she wishes to participate. A charter school student must be able to participate in curricular activities if that is a requirement for an extracurricular activity.

- 6. A student who transfers from a charter school program to a traditional public school before or during the first grading period of the school year is academically eligible to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities during the first grading period if the student has a successful evaluation from the previous school year, pursuant to subparagraph 2.
- 7. Any public school or private school student who has been unable to maintain academic eligibility for participation in interscholastic extracurricular activities is ineligible to participate in such activities as a charter school student until the student has successfully completed one grading period in a charter school pursuant to subparagraph 2. to become eligible to participate as a charter school student.
- (e) In addition to any other requirements as provided by law with the exception of paragraph (a), to be eligible to participate in extracurricular student activities other than athletics, a student must comply with the following policies:
- 1. Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the previous semester or a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1) if required by a district school board. District school boards are encouraged to require students who wish to participate in extracurricular activities other than athletics to maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its

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equivalent, in the previous semester or a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its 2 equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1). 3 4 2. Maintain satisfactory conduct and, if a student is convicted of, or is found to have committed, a felony or a 5 6 delinquent act that would have been a felony if committed by 7 an adult, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, the student's participation is contingent upon established and 8 published district school board policy. 9 10 If a district school board elects not to require a student to 11 maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, 12 13 or its equivalent, the board must do so at a district school board public meeting held under s. 1001.372. The board shall 14 15 offer its reasons for the board's decision not to require the minimum grade point average at the same public meeting. In 16 addition, the board shall report specific steps it is taking 17 to improve the grade point averages of the students 18 19 participating in extracurricular activities who would not meet the minimum grade point average if the policy were in force. 20 At each board meeting held under s. 1001.372 immediately 21 22 following each grading period, the board shall report the 23 number of students participating in extracurricular activities 2.4 other than athletics; the number of those students who would be below the minimum grade point average standard if the 25 policy were in force; the number of those students below the 26 minimum grade point average standard whose grade point average 27 has improved, declined, or remained the same, along with the 28 29 amount of change in grade point average per student; and the number of students who would meet the minimum grade point 30 average standard if the policy were in force. The board shall

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report this data in a manner consistent with s. 1002.22. If a board reports more than half of the students participating in 2 extracurricular activities other than athletics who are below 3 4 the minimum grade point average standard did not improve their grade point averages, the board must immediately adopt at its 5 next public meeting held under s. 1001.372, a minimum grade 7 point average requirement of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, for all students participating in extracurricular 8 activities. A board that opts to require the minimum grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, for 10 11 students participating in extracurricular activities other than athletics is exempt from this meeting and reporting 12 13 requirement. District school boards are encouraged to establish a process to waive the requirements of this 14 15 paragraph based on extenuating circumstances of an individual 16 student. (4) The student standards for participation in 17 18 interscholastic extracurricular activities must be applied 19 beginning with the student's first semester of the 9th grade. 20 Each student must meet such other requirements for 21 participation as may be established by the district school 22 board; however, a district school board may not establish 23 requirements for participation in interscholastic 24 extracurricular activities which make participation in such activities less accessible to home education students than to 25 other students. Except as set forth in paragraph (3)(c), 26 evaluation processes or requirements that are placed on home 27 28 education student participants may not go beyond those that 29 apply under s. 1002.41 to home education students generally. 30 (5) Any organization or entity that regulates or
