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14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section
17	466.004, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
18	466.004 Board of Dentistry
19	(2) To advise the board, it is the intent of the
20	Legislature that councils be appointed as specified in
21	paragraphs (a), (b), and (c). The department shall provide
22	administrative support to the councils and shall provide public
23	notice of meetings and agenda of the councils. Councils shall
24	include at least one board member who shall chair the council
25	and shall include nonboard members. All council members shall be
26	appointed by the board chair. Council members shall be appointed
27	for 4-year terms, and all members shall be eligible for
28	reimbursement of expenses in the manner of board members.

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29 (a) A Council on Dental Hygiene shall be appointed by the board chair and shall include one dental hygienist member of the 30 31 board, who shall chair the council, one dental member of the 32 board, and three dental hygienists recommended by the Florida 33 Dental Hygiene Association who are actively engaged in the 34 practice of dental hygiene in this state. The council shall meet at least three times each calendar year. Additional meetings may 35 36 be called at the request of the board chair, a majority of the members of the board or council, or the council chair. The 37 38 council is charged with the responsibility of and shall meet for the purpose of developing rules and policies for recommendation 39 to the board, which the board shall consider, on matters 40 41 pertaining to that part of dentistry consisting of educational, 42 preventive, or therapeutic dental hygiene services; dental 43 hygiene licensure, discipline, or regulation; and dental hygiene 44 education. Rule and policy recommendations of the council shall be considered by the board immediately following the submission 45 46 of the proposed rule or policy in the same manner as it 47 considers rule and policy recommendations from designated 48 subcommittees of the board. Any rule or policy proposed by the 49 board pertaining to the specified part of dentistry defined by 50 this paragraph shall be referred to the council for a recommendation prior to final action by the board. If the board 51 52 rejects the council's proposed rule or policy, the board must specify its objection to the council with particularity and 53 54 include any recommendation it may 55 have for the modification of the proposed rules or policy.

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Section 2. Subsections (2) and (3) of section 466.023, 56 57 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 466.023 Dental hygienists; scope and area of practice.--58 59 Dental hygienists may perform their duties: (2) (a) In the office of a licensed dentist or physician; 60 In public health programs and institutions of the 61 (b) Department of Children and Family Services, Department of 62 63 Health, and Department of Juvenile Justice under the general 64 supervision of a licensed dentist or physician; or 65 (c) Upon a patient of record of a dentist or physician who has issued a prescription for the services of a dental 66 hygienist, which prescription shall be valid for 2 years unless 67 a shorter length of time is designated by the dentist or 68 69 physician, in: 70 1. Licensed public and private health facilities.+ 71 2. Other public institutions of the state and federal 72 government.+ 3. Public and private educational institutions.+ 73 74 4. The home of a nonambulatory patient. ; and 75 Other places in accordance with the rules of the board. 5. 76 77 However, the dentist or physician issuing such prescription shall remain responsible for the care of such patient. As used 78 79 in this subsection, "patient of record" means a patient upon whom a dentist or physician has taken a complete medical 80 81 history, completed a clinical examination, recorded any 82 pathological conditions, and prepared a treatment plan.

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83 Dental hygienists may, without supervision, provide (3) 84 educational programs, faculty or staff training programs, and 85 authorized fluoride rinse programs; screening and referral of patients for comprehensive dental examinations at those 86 87 facilities, institutions, and places listed under paragraph (2)(c); and other services which do not involve diagnosis or 88 89 treatment of dental conditions and which services are approved by rule of the board. Screening results are not a diagnosis for 90 91 purposes of this chapter and shall be provided to patients assessed or to the parents or guardians of minor patients for a 92 93 dental referral for diagnosis.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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
