The 37 intergenerational respite care assisted living facility must: Meet all applicable requirements and standards 38 (a) 39 contained in part III of chapter 400, except that, for purposes 40 of this section, the term "resident" means a person of any age temporarily residing in and receiving care from the facility. 41 42 (b) Provide respite care services for minors and adults with disabilities and elderly persons with special needs for a 43 period of at least 24 hours but not for more than 14 consecutive 44 days. 45 Provide a facility or facilities in which minors and 46 (C) 47 adults reside in distinct and separate living units. Provide a facility that has a maximum of 48 beds, is 48 (d) 49 located in Miami-Dade County, and is operated by a not-forprofit entity. 50 51 (3) The agency may establish policies necessary to achieve 52 the objectives specific to the pilot program and may adopt rules 53 necessary to implement the program.
