15	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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17	Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Road Rage
18	Reduction Act."
19	Section 2. It is the intent of the Legislature to decrease
20	the incidence of drivers interfering with the movement of
21	traffic, to reduce road rage and aggressive driving, to minimize
22	crashes, and to promote the orderly, free flow of traffic on the
23	roads and highways of the state.
24	Section 3. Section 316.081, Florida Statutes, is amended

27	(1) Upon all roadways of sufficient width, a vehicle shall
28	be driven upon the right half of the roadway, except as follows:

29 When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding (a) 30 in the same direction under the rules governing such movement; When an obstruction exists making it necessary to 31 (b) 32 drive to the left of the center of the highway; provided any person so doing shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles 33 traveling in the proper direction upon the unobstructed portion 34 35 of the highway within such distance as to constitute an immediate hazard; 36 37 (C) Upon a roadway divided into three marked lanes for 38 traffic under the rules applicable thereon; or Upon a roadway designated and signposted for one-way 39 (d) traffic. 40 (2) Upon a two-lane roadway providing for two-way movement 41 42 of traffic, a vehicle all roadways, any vehicle proceeding at 43 less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and 44 under the conditions then existing shall be driven in the right-45 hand lane then available for traffic or as close as practicable

50 (3) Upon any roadway having four or more lanes for moving 51 traffic and providing for two-way movement of traffic, no 52 vehicle shall be driven to the left of the centerline of the 53 roadway, except when authorized by official traffic control 54 devices designating certain lanes to the left side of the center 55 of the roadway for use by traffic not otherwise permitted to use 56 such lanes, or except as permitted under paragraph (1)(b).

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57 However, this subsection shall not be construed as prohibiting the crossing of the centerline in making a left turn into or 58 59 from an alley, private road, or driveway. 60 (a) Upon a four-lane highway, an interstate highway, or a 61 highway with fully controlled access, or the Florida Intrastate 62 Highway System, a vehicle may not be driven in the left-hand 63 lane except when overtaking and passing another vehicle. (b) Paragraph (a) shall not apply: 64 65 1. When no other vehicle is directly behind the vehicle in 66 the left-hand lane; 67 2. When traffic conditions and congestion make it impractical to drive in the right-hand lane; 68 69 3. When inclement weather conditions make it necessary to 70 drive in the left-hand lane; 4. When obstructions or hazards exist in the right-hand 71 72 lane; 5. When, because of highway design, a vehicle must be 73 driven in the left-hand lane when preparing to exit; 74 75 6. 84 Section 4. Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section85 322.27, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

86 322.27 Authority of department to suspend or revoke 87 license.--

(3) There is established a point system for evaluation of 88 89 convictions of violations of motor vehicle laws or ordinances, 90 and violations of applicable provisions of s. 403.413(6)(b) when 91 such violations involve the use of motor vehicles, for the 92 determination of the continuing qualification of any person to 93 operate a motor vehicle. The department is authorized to suspend the license of any person upon showing of its records or other 94 good and sufficient evidence that the licensee has been 95 convicted of violation of motor vehicle laws or ordinances, or 96 applicable provisions of s. 403.413(6)(b), amounting to 12 or 97 98 more points as determined by the point system. The suspension 99 shall be for a period of not more than 1 year.

100 (d) The point system shall have as its basic element a 101 graduated scale of points assigning relative values to 102 convictions of the following violations:

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1. Reckless driving, willful and wanton--4 points.

104 2. Leaving the scene of a crash resulting in property105 damage of more than \$50--6 points.

106 3. Unlawful speed resulting in a crash--6 points.

- 4. Passing a stopped school bus--4 points.

a. Not in excess of 15 miles per hour of lawful or postedspeed--3 points.
