11	violating specified provisions that require operators of
12	motor vehicles to drive on the right side of the road;
13	requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor
14	Vehicles to provide an educational awareness campaign;
15	providing a grace period when warnings and educational
16	literature may be issued; providing effective dates.

18	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

20	Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Road Rage
21	Reduction Act."
22	Section 2. It is the intent of the Legislature to decrease
23	the incidence of drivers interfering with the movement of
24	traffic, to reduce road rage and aggressive driving, to minimize
25	crashes, and to promote the orderly, free flow of traffic on the
26	roads and highways of the state.
27	Section 3. Effective January 1, 2006, section 316.081,
28	Florida Statutes, is amended to read: Page1of6

316.081 Driving on right side of roadway; exceptions.--29 Upon all roadways of sufficient width, a vehicle shall 30 (1)be driven upon the right half of the roadway, except as follows: 31 When overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding 32 (a) 33 in the same direction under the rules governing such movement; When an obstruction exists making it necessary to (b) 34 drive to the left of the center of the highway; provided any 35 person so doing shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles 36 traveling in the proper direction upon the unobstructed portion 37 of the highway within such distance as to constitute an 38 immediate hazard; 39 Upon a roadway divided into three marked lanes for 40 (C) traffic under the rules applicable thereon; however, upon any 41 42 limited access roadway having two or more lanes for each direction of travel, any vehicle driven in the left-most lane 43 shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle traveling at a 44 45 higher speed by moving to the nearest lane to the right at the first practicable and safe opportunity; or 46 (d) Upon a roadway designated and signposted for one-way 47 traffic. 48 49 (2)Upon a two-lane roadway providing for two-way movement 50 of traffic, a vehicle all roadways, any vehicle proceeding at 51 less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and 52 under the conditions then existing shall be driven in the righthand lane then available for traffic or as close as practicable 53 to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway except when 54 55 overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same

56 direction or when preparing for a left turn at an intersection 57 or into a private road or driveway.

Upon any roadway having four or more lanes for moving 58 (3) traffic and providing for two-way movement of traffic, no 59 60 vehicle shall be driven to the left of the centerline of the roadway, except when authorized by official traffic control 61 devices designating certain lanes to the left side of the center 62 of the roadway for use by traffic not otherwise permitted to use 63 such lanes, or except as permitted under paragraph (1)(b). 64 However, this subsection shall not be construed as prohibiting 65 66 the crossing of the centerline in making a left turn into or from an alley, private road, or driveway. 67

68 (a) Upon a four-lane highway, an interstate highway, or a 69 highway with fully controlled access, or the Florida Intrastate 70 Highway System, a vehicle may not be driven in the left-hand 71 lane except when overtaking and passing another vehicle. 72 (b) Paragraph (a) shall not apply:

73 <u>1. When no other vehicle is directly behind the vehicle in</u>
74 the left-hand lane;

75 <u>2. When traffic conditions and congestion make it</u>
 76 <u>impractical to drive in the right-hand lane;</u>

77 <u>3. When inclement weather conditions make it necessary to</u>

83	6. On toll highways when necessary to use Sun-Pass and on
84	toll and other highways when driving in the left-hand lane is
85	required to comply with an official traffic control device; or
86	7. To law enforcement vehicles, ambulances, and other
87	emergency vehicles engaged in official duties and vehicles
88	engaged in highway maintenance and construction operations.
89	(4) A violation of this section is a noncriminal traffic
90	infraction, punishable as a moving violation as provided in
91	chapter 318.
92	Section 4. Paragraph (d) of subsection (3) of section
93	322.27, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
94	322.27 Authority of department to suspend or revoke
95	license
96	(3) There is established a point system for evaluation of
97	convictions of violations of motor vehicle laws or ordinances,
98	and violations of applicable provisions of s. 403.413(6)(b) when
99	such violations involve the use of motor vehicles, for the
100	determination of the continuing qualification of any person to
101	operate a motor vehicle. The department is authorized to suspend
102	the license of any person upon showing of its records or other
103	good and sufficient evidence that the licensee has been
104	convicted of violation of motor vehicle laws or ordinances, or
105	applicable provisions of s. 403.413(6)(b), amounting to 12 or
106	more points as determined by the point system. The suspension
107	shall be for a period of not more than 1 year.
108	(d) The point system shall have as its basic element a
109	graduated scale of points assigning relative values to

134	materials after July 1, 2005, and in public service

137	Section 6. Effective July 1, 2005, a driver of a motor
138	vehicle who does not violate the then-existing provisions of

violate those provisions as amended effective January 1, 2006,
may be issued a verbal warning and given educational literature
regarding the changes in this act by a law enforcement officer.
Section 7. Except as otherwise provided herein, this act
shall take effect July 1, 2005.
