A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged; amending s. 427.012, F.S.; revising the membership of the commission within the Department of Transportation; revising the number of members of the commission needed to constitute a quorum; requiring that candidates for appointment to the commission meet certain requirements for background screening; requiring that the Department of Transportation report to the commission any candidate who fails to meet the screening standards; requiring that the costs of screening be borne by the department or the candidate for appointment; providing for the commission to appointment technical advisory committees; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (1) and (4) of section 427.012, Florida Statutes, are amended, present subsections (5), (6), (7), and (8) of that section are redesignated as subsections (6), (7), (9), and (10), respectively, and new subsections (5) and (8) are added to that section, to read:

427.012 The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged. -- There is created the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged in the Department of Transportation.

- (1) The commission shall consist of the following members:
- (a) The Secretary of the Department of Transportation or

- (b) The Secretary of the Department of Children and Family Services or the secretary's designee.
- (c) The Commissioner of Education or the commissioner's designee.
- (d) The director of Workforce Innovation or the director's designee. The secretary of the Department of Labor and Employment Security or the secretary's designee.
- (e) The executive director of the Department of Veterans' Affairs or the executive director's designee.
- $\underline{\text{(e)}}$ The Secretary of the Department of Elderly Affairs or the secretary's designee.
- $\underline{\text{(f)}}$ The <u>Secretary</u> <u>director</u> of <u>the Agency for</u> Health Care Administration or the <u>secretary's</u> <u>director's</u> designee.
- $\underline{(g)}$ (h) A representative of the Florida Association \underline{of} Coordinated Transportation for Community Action, who shall serve at the pleasure of that association.
- (h)(i) A representative of the Florida <u>Public</u>

 <u>Transportation</u> <u>Transit</u> Association, who shall serve at the pleasure of that association.
- (i)(j) A person over the age of 60 who uses paratransit services. This is a member of a recognized statewide organization representing elderly Floridians. Such person shall be appointed by the Governor to represent elderly Floridians and shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years.
- (j)(k) A handicapped person with a disability who uses paratransit services. This is a member of a recognized statewide organization representing handicapped Floridians. Such person

shall be appointed by the Governor to represent <u>disabled</u>

handicapped Floridians and shall be appointed to serve a term of

4 years.

(k) One representative of a metropolitan planning organization who shall be appointed by the President of the Senate to a term of 4 years.

- (1) One representative of a designated official planning organization who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to a term of 4 years.
- (m) Seven members appointed for terms of 4 years each who shall be from each of the seven districts of the Department of Transportation. The Governor shall appoint four of the seven members who shall be from urban department districts and the Commissioner of Agriculture shall appoint three of the seven members who shall be from rural department districts. Each member is subject to confirmation by the Senate.
- (1) Two citizen advocate representatives who shall be appointed by the Governor for a term of 4 years, one representing rural citizens and one representing urban citizens.
- (m) A representative of the community transportation coordinators. Such person shall be appointed by the Governor to represent all community transportation coordinators and shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years.
- (n) One member of the Early Childhood Council. Such person shall be appointed by the Governor to represent maternal and child health care providers and shall be appointed to serve a term of 4 years.

private not-for-profit transportation operators each of which have a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience operating a broad-based system of ambulatory and wheelchair/stretcher type transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles and including dispatch and scheduling responsibilities. Such persons shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a term of 4 years.

- (p) Four representatives of current private for-profit or private not-for-profit transportation operators, each of which having a minimum of 5 years of continuous experience operating a broad-based system of ambulatory and wheelchair or stretcher-type transportation, utilizing not less than 50 vehicles, and including dispatch and scheduling responsibilities. Such persons shall be appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture to serve a term of 4 years.
- (q) Six citizens representing the nontransportation business community of the state, three members appointed by the President of the Senate and three members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- (4) The commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the call of the chairperson. Seven Nine members of the commission constitute a quorum, and a majority vote of the members present is necessary for any action taken by the commission.
- (5) Each candidate for appointment to the commission shall, before accepting the appointment, undergo background screening pursuant to s. 435.04 by filing with the Department of Transportation a complete set of fingerprints taken by an

authorized law enforcement agency. These fingerprints shall be submitted to the Department of Law Enforcement for state processing, and that department shall in turn submit the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for federal processing. The Department of Transportation shall screen the background results and report to the commission any candidate who fails to meet level 2 screening standards pursuant to s. 435.04. Any candidate found through fingerprint processing to have failed to meet level 2 screening standards pursuant to s. 435.04 may not be appointed as a member of the commission. The cost of the background screening may be borne by the Department of Transportation or the candidate for appointment to the commission.

(8) The commission may appoint technical advisory committees to advise the commission on issues of importance to the state and to regions of the state. A technical advisory committee shall provide information, advice, and direction to the commission on the coordination of services for the transportation disadvantaged. The commission may establish the size, composition, and focus of each committee created. A member appointed to a technical advisory committee shall serve without compensation and is not entitled to per diem or travel expenses. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
