A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to the Autism Spectrum Disorder Medicaid Waiver Program; amending s. 409.912, 3 F.S.; requiring the Agency for Health Care 4 5 Administration to work with the Agency for 6 Persons with Disabilities to develop a Medicaid 7 waiver program for children with Autism Spectrum Disorder; providing a definition; 8 9 providing for implementation subject to the 10 availability of funds; authorizing the agency to adopt rules; providing an effective date. 11 12 13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 14 Section 1. Subsection (50) is added to section 15 409.912, Florida Statutes, to read: 16 17 409.912 Cost-effective purchasing of health care. -- The agency shall purchase goods and services for Medicaid 18 recipients in the most cost-effective manner consistent with 19 the delivery of quality medical care. To ensure that medical 20 services are effectively utilized, the agency may, in any 2.1 22 case, require a confirmation or second physician's opinion of 23 the correct diagnosis for purposes of authorizing future services under the Medicaid program. This section does not 2.4 restrict access to emergency services or poststabilization 25 care services as defined in 42 C.F.R. part 438.114. Such 26 27 confirmation or second opinion shall be rendered in a manner 2.8 approved by the agency. The agency shall maximize the use of 29 prepaid per capita and prepaid aggregate fixed-sum basis services when appropriate and other alternative service 30 delivery and reimbursement methodologies, including

competitive bidding pursuant to s. 287.057, designed to 2 facilitate the cost-effective purchase of a case-managed continuum of care. The agency shall also require providers to 3 minimize the exposure of recipients to the need for acute 4 5 inpatient, custodial, and other institutional care and the 6 inappropriate or unnecessary use of high-cost services. The 7 agency may mandate prior authorization, drug therapy 8 management, or disease management participation for certain populations of Medicaid beneficiaries, certain drug classes, 9 or particular drugs to prevent fraud, abuse, overuse, and 10 possible dangerous drug interactions. The Pharmaceutical and 11 12 Therapeutics Committee shall make recommendations to the 13 agency on drugs for which prior authorization is required. The agency shall inform the Pharmaceutical and Therapeutics 14 Committee of its decisions regarding drugs subject to prior 15 authorization. The agency is authorized to limit the entities 16 17 it contracts with or enrolls as Medicaid providers by 18 developing a provider network through provider credentialing. The agency may limit its network based on the assessment of 19 beneficiary access to care, provider availability, provider 20 21 quality standards, time and distance standards for access to 22 care, the cultural competence of the provider network, 23 demographic characteristics of Medicaid beneficiaries, practice and provider-to-beneficiary standards, appointment 2.4 wait times, beneficiary use of services, provider turnover, 2.5 26 provider profiling, provider licensure history, previous 27 program integrity investigations and findings, peer review, 2.8 provider Medicaid policy and billing compliance records, clinical and medical record audits, and other factors. 29 30 Providers shall not be entitled to enrollment in the Medicaid 31

provider network. The agency is authorized to seek federal 2 waivers necessary to implement this policy. 3 (50) The Agency for Health Care Administration shall 4 work with the Agency for Persons with Disabilities to develop 5 a home and community-based waiver program to provide personal 6 care assistance, respite, and applied behavioral analysis for 7 children who are diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder. For the purposes of this subsection, "Autism Spectrum Disorder" 8 9 means a neurological disorder that affects reasoning, social 10 interaction, and communication, may affect the functioning of the brain, and is usually evident before a child is 3 years of 11 12 age. The Agency for Health Care Administration shall seek 13 federal waiver approval and implement the approved waiver subject to the availability of funds and any limitations 14 provided in the General Appropriations Act.
