Subsection (7) is added to section 400.602, 16 17 Florida Statutes, to read: 18 400.602 Licensure required; prohibited acts; exemptions; 19 display, transferability of license.--20 (7) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 400.601(3), any 21 hospice that is organized as a for-profit corporation and 22 provides a continuum of palliative and supportive care for the 23 terminally ill patient and his or her family may obtain a Page 1 of 3

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CS 24 license in accordance with the other requirements of this part 25 and upon receipt of any certificate of need that may be required under the provisions of ss. 408.031-408.045 to provide care in a 26 27 hospice service area where a for-profit hospice is currently 28 licensed to operate under subsections (5) and (6). Section 2. No later than January 1, 2006, the Office of 29 Program Policy and Government Accountability, in consultation 30 with the Agency for Health Care Administration, shall submit a 31 report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 32 House of Representatives that analyzes the impact of hospices on 33 34 the delivery of care to terminally ill patients. The report 35 shall include: 36 (1) A comprehensive statistical analysis of Florida hospice care from January 1, 1999, to June 30, 2005. 37 (2) A comprehensive analysis of the scope of services 38 39 provided by Florida hospices and a comparison of those services to the minimum service requirements of Medicare and Medicaid. 40 (3) An analysis of hospice service areas and penetration 41 42 rates of hospice services by hospice service area, including a 43 discussion of reasons for the existence of regional monopolies. (4) An analysis of the services provided to and quality of 44 45 care experienced by patients of for-profit hospices in Florida 46 and other states. (5) An analysis of potential changes in the competitive 47 48 marketplace in Florida which may be produced by the introduction 49 of additional for-profit hospices.

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50	(6) An analysis of the effect that the presence of for-
51	profit hospices has had on hospice service delivery and quality
52	in other states.
53	(7) The projected cost of introduction of additional for-
54	profit hospices in Florida to the Medicaid program.
55	(8) Any other relevant information.
56	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
