A bill to be entitled

An act relating to youthful drivers; amending s. 318.143, F.S.; authorizing the court to require a minor found to have committed certain traffic infractions and the minor's parents or guardians to participate in a registered youthful driver monitoring service; creating s. 318.1435, F.S.; providing for youthful driver monitoring services to notify parents or guardians with information about a minor's driving; providing for registration with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; amending s. 322.16, F.S.; revising license restrictions for certain minors participating in a registered youthful driver monitoring service; creating s. 627.06525, F.S.; authorizing insurance discounts for participation in a registered youthful driver monitoring service; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (1) of section 318.143, Florida Statutes, to read:
 - 318.143 Sanctions for infractions by minors.--
- (1) If the court finds that a minor has committed a violation of any of the provisions of chapter 316, the court may also impose one or more of the following sanctions:
- (f) The court may require the minor and his or her parents or guardians to participate in a registered youthful driver monitoring service as described in s. 318.1435.

Section 2. Section 318.1435, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

318.1435 Youthful driver monitoring services.--

- (1) A "youthful driver monitoring service" is an entity that enables parents or guardians to monitor the driving performance of their minor children. The service may provide monitoring by either or both of the following methods:
- (a) The posting of a placard on a vehicle that shows a toll-free telephone number and a unique identifying number and includes a request to members of the public to call the toll-free telephone number to report inappropriate driving practices.

 The service shall enter into a contract with the parents or guardians under which the service shall timely forward to the parents or guardians all reports of inappropriate driving practices by the minor child.
- (b) Wireless telephones or similar technologies using a global positioning system. The service shall enter into a contract with the parents or guardians under which the service shall provide the parents or guardians with real-time information about the location and speed of movement of the minor child or the vehicle in which the minor child is traveling.
- (2) A youthful driver monitoring service may register with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. The registration shall consist of a narrative description of the services offered by the youthful driver monitoring service, the name of the manager in charge of the service, the service's address, and the service's telephone number. Registration under

this subsection remains valid indefinitely, but it is the responsibility of the youthful driver monitoring service to timely file a revised registration statement to reflect any changes in the required information. If the department determines that the youthful driver monitoring service is not providing the services described in the narrative statement, the department may suspend the registration; however, the department must reinstate the registration when the service files a revised statement reflecting its actual practices.

Section 3. Subsections (2) and (3) of section 322.16, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

322.16 License restrictions.--

- (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), a person who holds a driver's license and who is under 17 years of age, when operating a motor vehicle after 11 p.m. and before 6 a.m., must be accompanied by a driver who holds a valid license to operate the type of vehicle being operated and is at least 21 years of age unless that person is driving directly to or from work.
- (3)(a) A person who holds a driver's license who is 17 years of age, when operating a motor vehicle after 1 a.m. and before 5 a.m., must be accompanied by a driver who holds a valid license to operate the type of vehicle being operated, and is at least 21 years of age unless that person is driving directly to or from work.
- (b) A person who holds a driver's license who is at least 16 years and 6 months of age but less than 18 years of age, and who is a participant in a registered youthful driver monitoring service as described in s. 318.1435, when operating a motor

vehicle after 1 a.m. and before 5 a.m., must be accompanied by a driver who holds a valid license to operate the type of vehicle being operated and is at least 21 years of age unless that person is driving directly to or from work.

Section 4. Section 627.06525, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

627.06525 Insurance discounts for participation in registered youthful driver monitoring services.--

- (1) Any rates, rating schedules, or rating manuals for the liability, personal injury protection, and collision coverages of a motor vehicle insurance policy may provide for an appropriate reduction in premium charges if any driver covered under the policy is a minor child who is participating in a registered youthful driver monitoring service as described in s. 318.1435.
- (2) If an insurer makes a rate filing that includes the premium discount referred to in subsection (1), the amount of the discount shall be deemed approved and the insurer may apply the discount unless the office determines that the discount will produce a rate that is inadequate or unfairly discriminatory.
- Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
