A bill to be entitled

An act relating to chiropractic education; amending s. 400.9905, F.S.; providing that pt. XIII of ch. 400, F.S., the Health Care Clinic Act, does not apply to clinical facilities affiliated with certain chiropractic colleges; creating s. 460.4064, F.S.; providing legislative intent; authorizing chiropractic college-based internships; providing eligibility requirements for registration of chiropractic interns; providing requirements for approval of chiropractic college-based internship programs; requiring an annual report to the Board of Chiropractic Medicine; requiring the board to adopt implementing rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (j) is added to subsection (4) of section 400.9905, Florida Statutes, to read:

400.9905 Definitions.--

- (4) "Clinic" means an entity at which health care services are provided to individuals and which tenders charges for reimbursement for such services, including a mobile clinic and a portable equipment provider. For purposes of this part, the term does not include and the licensure requirements of this part do not apply to:
- (j) Clinical facilities affiliated with a college of chiropractic accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education at which training is provided for chiropractic students.

Section 2. Section 460.4064, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

460.4064 Chiropractic college-based internships; registration of participating chiropractic interns.--

- (1) It is the intent of the Legislature to authorize and encourage the participation of chiropractic students in internship programs based in clinics associated with colleges of chiropractic accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education. Such chiropractic college-based internships are an alternative to the community-based internships provided in s. 460.402(6).
- (2) Any chiropractic student desiring to provide chiropractic treatment as a chiropractic intern participating in a chiropractic college-based internship program shall apply to the department to be registered as a chiropractic intern and remit a fee, not to exceed \$100, as set by the board. The department shall register any applicant the board certifies meets the following requirements:
 - (a) Is at least 21 years of age.
- (b) Has not committed any act or offense within or outside the state that would constitute the basis for disciplinary action under this chapter or chapter 456.
- (c) Is not currently under investigation in any state for an act or offense that would constitute the basis for disciplinary action under this chapter or chapter 456.
- (3) Registration under this section is valid for a period of 1 year and may be renewed upon payment of a renewal fee, not to exceed \$100, as set by the board.

(4) A chiropractic student is eligible to register as a chiropractic intern under this section only if the chiropractic college-based internship program has been approved by the board. The board shall approve a chiropractic college-based internship program if the program meets the following requirements:

- (a) The program shall meet current Council on Chiropractic Education standards for consumer protection.
- (b) The program shall be an established component of the curriculum offered by the college of chiropractic.
- (c) The program shall require all interns who participate in the program to meet all requirements for internship as established by the Council on Chiropractic Education.
- (d) The program shall provide for supervision of interns by full-time or adjunct faculty members, pursuant to a supervision plan submitted by the college and approved by the board. The plan shall specify the procedures that may be performed by interns, the degree of supervision over each intern, the number of interns that may be supervised by any one faculty member, the qualifications required for faculty members to participate in the program, the legal liability for the acts or omissions of the intern, and such other matters as the board requires by rule.
- (5) A college of chiropractic operating a college-based internship program shall annually report to the board the names and license or certificate numbers of all faculty members participating in the program.
- (6) The board shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to implement this section.
