13-1215-05 1 Senate Resolution No. 2 A resolution honoring Rotary International on 3 the occasion of its 100th anniversary and recognizing February 23, 2005, as Rotary Day in 4 5 Florida. б 7 WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Chicago was founded on 8 February 23, 1905, when Chicago attorney Paul Harris and three business associates formed a club to share "mutual cooperation 9 10 and informal friendship such as all of us had once known in our villages, " and 11 12 WHEREAS, by 1921, Rotary Clubs had been formed on six 13 continents, prompting the adoption of the name Rotary International in 1922, and 14 WHEREAS, as Rotary International grew, its focus 15 changed from serving the business and professional needs of 16 17 its members to serving communities in need, a sentiment expressed in its motto: "Service Above Self," and 18 WHEREAS, the Rotary Foundation, established in 1928, 19 has garnered contributions in excess of \$80 million annually 20 21 to support a range of humanitarian grants and educational 22 programs, and 23 WHEREAS, in 1985, Rotary International made a commitment to immunize all of the world's children against 2.4 polio, and by the centennial of Rotary in 2005, more than \$500 25 million will have been committed to the eradication of polio, 26 27 and 28 WHEREAS, Rotary International, approaching its 100th anniversary, consists of 1.2 million members in some 31,000 29 30 Rotary clubs in 166 countries, all committed to addressing 31 1
