Pursuant to section 189.429, Florida Statutes, 16 17 this act constitutes the codification of all special acts relating to the Avalon Beach-Mulat Fire Protection District. It 18 19 is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this law to provide 20 a single, comprehensive special act charter for the district, 21 including all current legislative authority granted to the 22 district by its several legislative enactments and any additional authority granted by this act. 23 Page 1 of 8

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Section 4. Reports and estimated budget
(1) The board shall make an annual report of its actions
and accounting of its funds and shall file said report in
accordance with Article VII of the State Constitution, and
chapters 191, 192, and 218, Florida Statutes.
(2) The board shall file and publish its annual budget
showing estimated revenue and estimated expenditures incurred by
the district in carrying out its operations pursuant to Article
VII of the State Constitution, and chapters 191, 192, and 218,
Florida Statutes.
Section 5. SeverabilityIf any clause, section, or
provision of this act shall be declared to be unconstitutional
or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the same
shall be eliminated from this act, and the remaining portion of
said act shall be in force and effect and be as valid as if such
invalid portion thereof had not been incorporated therein,
provided the same may be so separated.
Section 4. <u>Chapters 80-608, 82-378, 82-379, and 91-392,</u>
Laws of Florida, are repealed.
Section 5. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
