11-1610-05 1 Senate Resolution No. 2 A resolution recognizing October 2005 as "Greyhound Adoption Month." 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Greyhound dog is one of the oldest б currently existing breeds, and 7 WHEREAS, the Greyhound's origin is deeply rooted in ancient history, with dogs looking similar to today's 8 Greyhound depicted more than 4,000 years ago on the walls of 9 ancient Egyptian tombs, and 10 WHEREAS, the Arabs so admired the physical attributes 11 12 and speed of the Greyhound that it was the only animal 13 permitted to share their tents and ride atop their camels, and WHEREAS, the Greyhound arrived in Europe 3,500 years 14 ago, and in 1014 A.D., King Canute of England enacted the 15 Forest Laws, which stated that only noblemen could own and 16 17 hunt with Greyhounds, and WHEREAS, Queen Elizabeth I abolished the Forest Laws in 18 the 1500s and later initiated the first formal rules of 19 "Greyhound coursing," the pursuit of hares, and 20 21 WHEREAS, in the late 1800s, farmers imported Greyhounds 22 to the United States to help control jackrabbit populations and, because of their speed and natural instincts, Greyhounds 23 soon became the focus of popular neighborhood competitions -2.4 the first organized Greyhound racing events, and 25 WHEREAS, Greyhound racing as we know it today began in 26 27 1912 with Owen Patrick Smith's invention of a mechanical lure 2.8 that could circle a track, with the first track opening in 1919 in Emeryville, California, and 29 30 31
