26	such work does not include direct connections to a sanitary
27	sewer system or to potable water lines. The installation,
28	construction, modification, or replacement of equipment
29	permanently attached to and associated with the pool or spa
30	for the purpose of water treatment or cleaning of the pool or
31	spa requires licensure <u>and the usage of such equipment for the</u>
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1 purposes of water treatment or cleaning on commercial or public pools or spas requires licensure; however, the usage of 2 such equipment for the purposes of water treatment or cleaning 3 4 residential pools or spas shall not require licensure unless the usage involves construction, modification, or replacement 5 of such equipment. Water treatment that does not require such 6 7 equipment does not require a license. In addition, a license shall not be required for the cleaning of the pool or spa in 8 any way that does not affect the structural integrity of the 9 10 residential pool or spa or its associated equipment. 11 (1) "Swimming pool/spa servicing contractor" means a contractor whose scope of work involves, but is not limited 12 13 to, the repair and servicing of any swimming pool, or hot tub or spa, whether public, or private, or otherwise, regardless 14 15 of use. The scope of work includes the repair or replacement of existing equipment; any cleaning or equipment sanitizing; 16 which requires at least a partial disassembling, excluding 17 18 filter changes, and the installation of new pool/spa 19 20 addition of pool heaters: the repair or replacement of all 21 perimeter piping and filter piping; the repair of equipment 22 rooms or housing for pool/spa equipment; - and the substantial or complete draining of a swimming pool, or hot tub or spa, 23 24 for the purpose of any repair or renovation. The scope of such work does not include direct connections to a sanitary sewer 25 system or to potable water lines. 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1	cleaning on commercial or public pools or spas requires
2	licensure; however, the usage of such equipment for the
3	purposes of water treatment or cleaning <u>on residential pools</u>
4	or spas shall not require licensure unless the usage involves

б	disassembly, or replacement of such equipment. Water treatment
7	that does not require such equipment does not require a
8	license. In addition, a license shall not be required for the
9	cleaning of the pool or spa in any way that does not affect
10	the structural integrity of the pool or spa or its associated

12	(20) "Provisional license" means a license granted to
13	a swimming pool/spa servicing contractor who has met all
14	qualifications for licensure but has no proven work experience
15	related to the scope of work of such a contractor. A
16	provisional license shall be effective for a period of 1 year
17	from the date of issuance, at which time a license will be
18	granted to the individual or business organization qualified
19	by that individual. During the term of provisional licensure,
20	the contractor shall be prohibited from performing any work
21	involving public swimming pools, or hot tubs or spas, interior
22	refinishing of private swimming pools, or hot tubs or spas,
23	and any draining of a private swimming pool, or hot tub or
24	spa, for the purpose of any repair or renovation. During the
25	term of provisional licensure, the contractor may partially
26	drain up to 75 percent of a private swimming pool, or hot tub
27	or spa, for the purposes of water treatment.

Has received a baccalaureate degree from an accredited 4-year college in the appropriate field of 5 engineering, architecture, or building construction and has 1 6 7 year of proven experience in the category in which the person seeks to qualify. For the purpose of this part, a minimum of 8 2,000 person-hours shall be used in determining full-time 9 10 equivalency.

11 2. Has a total of at least 4 years of active experience as a worker who has learned the trade by serving an 12 13 apprenticeship as a skilled worker who is able to command the rate of a mechanic in the particular trade or as a foreman who 14 15 is in charge of a group of workers and usually is responsible to a superintendent or a contractor or his or her equivalent, 16 provided, however, that at least 1 year of active experience 17 shall be as a foreman. 18

3. Has a combination of not less than 1 year of 19 20 experience as a foreman and not less than 3 years of credits for any accredited college-level courses; has a combination of 21 22 not less than 1 year of experience as a skilled worker, 1 year of experience as a foreman, and not less than 2 years of 23 24 credits for any accredited college-level courses; or has a combination of not less than 2 years of experience as a 25 skilled worker, 1 year of experience as a foreman, and not 26 less than 1 year of credits for any accredited college-level 27 courses. All junior college or community college-level courses 28 29 shall be considered accredited college-level courses. 4.a.
