An act relating to the Florida Aerospace Infrastructure Investment Trust Fund; creating s. 331.508, F.S.; creating the Florida Aerospace Infrastructure Investment Trust Fund within the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development; providing for sources and uses of funds; providing for future review and termination or re-creation of the fund; providing a contingent effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 331.508, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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331.508 Florida Aerospace Infrastructure Trust Fund.--

(1) The Florida Aerospace Infrastructure Investment Trust

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Fund is created within, and shall be administered by, the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. Moneys credited to

18 19 the fund shall be all those sales taxes on tangible personal property, admissions, tours, and leases or licenses of real

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property generated by dealers conducting business at the Kennedy

21 22 Space Center and the Cape Canaveral Air Force Station pursuant to ss. 212.04(1)(a), 212.05, and 212.031(1)(a). Funds shall be

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used by the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development

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as grants in aid to further the Florida Aerospace Infrastructure Program of the Florida Aerospace Finance Corporation.

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(2) Each dealer shall file a return each month with the Department of Revenue with segregated tax information regarding

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taxes collected on sales, admissions, tours, leases, and

- (3) In accordance with s. 19(f)(2), Art. III of the State Constitution, the trust fund shall, unless terminated sooner, be terminated July 1, 2009. Before its scheduled termination, the trust fund shall be reviewed as provided in s. 215.3206(1) and (2).
- Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005, only if enacted by a three-fifths vote of the membership of each house of the Legislature and only if HB 1701 or similar legislation is enacted during the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.
