- 55 The Commission on the Future of Space in Florida is 56 created. The commission shall be composed of 13 voting members, 57 7 of whom are appointed by the Governor, 3 of whom are appointed by the President of the Senate, and 3 of whom are appointed by 58 59 the Speaker of the House of Representatives. In consultation with the Florida Congressional Delegation, the Governor shall 60 61 appoint two members of the delegation or their designees to 62 serve as ex officio, nonvoting members of the commission. In 63 addition, the Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of Transportation, 64 executive director of the Florida Space Authority, and director 65 of the Agency for Workforce Innovation or their designees shall serve as ex officio, nonvoting members of the commission.
