Section 430.901, Florida Statutes, is 18 created to read: 430.901 Multiservice senior center; definition; 19 purpose.--A "multiservice senior center" is: 20 21 (1) A community facility that is a highly visible focal point for the organization and provision of a broad 22 23 spectrum of services suited to the diverse needs and interests of independent older persons, which may include nutritional 2.4 meals; health, mental health, social, wellness, respite care, 25 and education services; and recreational activities. 26 27 (2) An entity that may partner with an aging resource 2.8 center to provide for easier access to long-term care services by seniors and their families who reside within the local 29 30 community. 31

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1 (3) A setting that provides opportunities that enable 2 participants to stay connected to their communities and their 3 support networks. 4 (4) Designed to offer preventive screenings, activities, and services that may divert seniors from more 5 б extensive in-home services and help reduce, delay, or prevent 7 premature institutionalization. (5) Designed for ease of access and use by seniors 8 with varying levels of physical abilities. 9 10 Section 2. Section 430.206, Florida Statutes, is renumbered as section 430.902, Florida Statutes, and amended 11 12 to read: 13 430.902 430.206 Multiservice senior center.--(1) If practicable, multiservice senior center 14 services shall be available to functionally impaired elderly 15 16 persons. 17 (2) If feasible, a multiservice senior center should must be centrally located and easily accessible to public 18 transportation. Provision may be made for transporting persons 19 to the center. A center shall be designed to provide ease of 20 21 access and use, considering the infirmities of elderly 2.2 persons. 23 (3)(a) Each multiservice senior center is encouraged to have on the premises at all times a functioning automated 2.4 external defibrillator. 25 (b) Multiservice senior centers that provide automated 26 27 external defibrillators shall ensure that personnel are 2.8 properly trained in accordance with s. 401.2915. (c) The location of each automated external 29 defibrillator shall be registered with a local emergency 30 medical services medical director. 31

Subsections (11), (12), and (13) of section 9 430.203, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (10), 10 (11), and (12), respectively, and subsection (10) of that 11 12 section is amended to read: 13 430.203 Community care for the elderly; definitions.--As used in ss. 430.201-430.207, the term: 14 (10) "Multiservice senior center" means a community 15 16 facility for the organization and provision of a broad 17 spectrum of services, which shall include provision of health, 18 including mental health, social, nutritional, and education services, and the provision of facilities for recreational 19 activities for persons 60 years of age or older. 20 21 Section 4. Subsection (2) of section 430.205, Florida 22 Statutes, is amended to read: 23 430.205 Community care service system.--(2) Core services and other support services may be 2.4 furnished by public or private agencies or organizations. Each 25 community care service system must be under the direction of a 26 27 lead agency that coordinates the activities of individual 2.8 contracting agencies providing community-care-for-the-elderly services. When practicable, the activities of a community care 29 service area <u>may</u> must be directed from a multiservice senior 30 center, as defined in s. 430.901, and coordinated with other 31
